ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

PETER J. AIELLO SANCTIONED

The Commission has accepted an Offer of Settlement from Peter J. Aiello and issued an order making findings and imposing sanctions. Without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's January 11, 1982 Order for Proceedings, Aiello consented to findings that he wilfully violated Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5. The proceeding arose out of Aiello's involvement in the 1979 sales of shares of Revest Resources Corp.

The Commission's Order suspends Aiello from association with any broker or dealer for four months. (Rel. 34-19850)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

EXECUTIVE INVESTMENT CORP. AND JOHN H. KIMMEL III CONSENT

The Washington Regional Office announced that on June 3 the Honorable James R. Miller, U.S. District Judge for the District of Maryland, entered Orders with the consent of defendants permanently enjoining Executive Investment Corp. and John H. Kimmell III from violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The Orders also called for the continuation of a freeze on defendants' assets and the continuation of discovery by Plaintiff in order to complete an accounting of all investor funds, securities or other assets paid to or received by defendants. The Court retains jurisdiction over the action for the purpose of ordering such further equitable relief as it may deem proper. (SEC v. Executive Investment Corp. and John H. Kimmell III, U.S.D.C., D. Md., Civil Action No. M-83-1393). (LR-10031)

COMPLAINT NAMES ANEFECO, INC.

The Commission announced that on June 7 it filed a civil injunctive action in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Anefco, Inc. of Ridgefield, Connecticut. The Commission's complaint alleges violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws and seeks a Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief.

The Commission alleges that Anefco, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct, failed to file its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended December 31, 1982, required to have been filed by March 31, 1983, and its Quarterly Report on Form 10-Q for its quarter ended March 31, 1983, required to have been filed by May 16, 1983, failed to file various periodic reports in a timely manner, and failed to file required Notifications of Late Filing on Form 12b-25. The Commission requests that the Court order Anefco to file its delinquent annual and quarterly reports and enjoin it from further violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. Anefco, Inc., U.S.D.C. D.C., Civil Action No. 83-1617). (LR-10034)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE BENCHMARK FUND MONEY MARKET AND GOVERNMENT PORTFOLIOS

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 exempting The Benchmark Tax-Exempt Fund (BTF) from the provisions of Section 12(d)(3) of the Act to permit it to acquire rights to sell its portfolio securities to brokers and dealers, and exempting BTF and The Benchmark Fund Money Market and Government Portfolios from the provisions of Section 2(a)(41) of the Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 to permit them to compute their respective net asset values per unit using the amortized cost method of valuation and to permit BTF to value rights in the manner described in the application. NEW YORK MUNICIPAL FUND FOR TEMPORARY INVESTMENT, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 5 to request a hearing on an application filed by New York Municipal Fund for Temporary Investment, Inc., an open-end, management investment company, for an order, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, exempting Applicant: (1) from the provisions of Section 12(d)(3) of the Act to permit it to acquire stand-by commitments from brokers or dealers; and (2) from the provisions of Section 2(a)(41) of the Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 to permit it to value its portfolio securities using the amortized cost method of valuation and to value stand-by commitments acquired from banks, brokers, or dealers in the manner described in the application. SHEARSON DAILY DIVIDEND INC.

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

AEP GENERATING COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing AEP Generating Company (AEGCo), subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to issue up to \$300 million of unsecured notes through March 31, 1984, at a fixed rate of interest up to 200 basis points above the prime rate for terms from two to ten years and to use the proceeds either to prepay or repay notes outstanding which bear a fluctuating interest rate under a \$450 million revolving credit agreement or in lieu of further borrowings under the revolving credit agreement. AEGCo was also authorized to enter into hedging agreements with banks whereby AEGCo would agree to make payments of interest at a fixed rate based on a principal amount of up to \$300 million, in return for the bank's agreement to make payments of interest to AEGCo based upon the same principal amount and bearing interest at a rate which is a function of the LIBO Rate payable by AEGCo under the revolving credit agreement.
