ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

J. DANIEL BELL AND COMPANY, INC. REVOKED;
J. DANIEL BELL SUSPENDED

The Commission announced the institution of administrative proceedings under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against J. Daniel Bell and Company, Inc. (Bell Co), a Denver Colorado broker-dealer, and J. Daniel Bell (Bell) of Denver. Simultaneously with the institution of the proceedings, the Commission accepted an Offer of Settlement submitted by Bell Co and Bell in which they consented to the entry of findings and, without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations, the imposition of a revocation of Bell Co's registration. Bell consented to a suspension from association with a broker or dealer in any capacity for a period of six months; a bar

from acting as a principal, officer, director, owner or employee in a non-supervisory capacity, provided, however, that at the end of 12 months he may apply to the Commission for permission to work in a capacity of a principal (other than financial principal), officer, director, owner or some other supervisory capacity; and a bar from acting as a financial principal of a broker or dealer, provided, however, that at the end of five years he may apply to the Commission for permission to work in the capacity of financial principal of a broker-dealer.

The Commission's order found that Bell Co and Bell wilfully violated Sections 15(b), 15(c)(2), 15(c)(3) and 17(a) of the Exchange Act and Rules 15b3-1, 15c2-4, 15c3-1, 15c3-3, 17a-3, 17a-4, 17a-5 and 17a-11 thereunder. Also, the order found that Bell Co wilfully violated Section 17(a) of the Exchange Act and Rule 17a-13 thereunder. (Rel. 34-19867)

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

RECORD HIGH 1983 OFFERING VOLUME SHIFT FROM DEBT TO EQUITY SECURITIES

Primary public offering volume from January through April of this year is at a year-to-date record high level according to figures released today by the Commission's Directorate of Economic and Policy Analysis. At \$40 billion, the volume is more than double the comparable 1982 figure of \$17.5 billion.

A shift toward equity securities is also evident in 1983, with this year's volume split 52% debt/48% equity securities. In 1982, the split was 59% debt/41% equity. This shift is more pronounced in the manufacturing sector, with 1983 volume of \$9.3 billion consisting of 49% debt/51% equity. As a result of this shift and higher 1983 volume, equity security volume through April has increased from \$7.1 billion in 1982 to \$19.3 billion in 1983.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST MICHAEL A TRAIGER AND TRAIGER ENERGY INVESTMENTS

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on May 2 a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California against Michael A. Traiger and Traiger Energy Investments. The complaint charges that the defendants violated the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 by selling \$5 million of securities in the form of limited partnership interests while a registration statement on Form S-1 was pending but had not yet been declared effective and for which no exemption from registration was available. The proceeds from the sale of these unregistered securities were to be used to engage in exploratory and developmental drilling for oil and gas. (SEC v. Michael A. Traiger, Traiger Energy Investments, U.S.D.C. C.D. Cal., Civil Action No. 83-2738-LTL JPx). (LR-10042)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

BRIAN PATRICK SMITH CONVICTED

The United States Attorney for the Eastern District of New York and the SEC New York Regional Office announced that on June 7 Brian Patrick Smith was convicted on all counts of a 17 count indictment charging securities fraud and wire fraud in connection with transactions in the securities of Jupiter Development Corporation, Ltd. Smith was convicted of opening and causing to be opened brokerage accounts in his own name and in the names of other individuals and placing orders for the purchase of Jupiter stock in these accounts at three broker-dealers registered with the Commission. Smith fraudulently concealed that he would not have sufficient funds to pay for all Jupiter stock ordered unless the price of the securities increased. If the price of Jupiter stock increased, Smith used the increased value of his Jupiter securities to generate credit and borrow money to pay for his original orders. When

the price of Jupiter stock declined, Smith failed and refused to make payment, thus transferring the loss to the broker-dealers. In connection with this scheme, Smith tendered checks drawn on his personal checking accounts at two Canadian banks. Smith knew or had reason to know that these checks were of no value in that they were drawn on accounts with funds insufficient to pay the stated amounts. Each count is punishable by five years imprisonment and the fines, for all counts, total \$89,000. Sentencing is scheduled for July 13, 1983. (U.S. v. Brian Patrick Smith, 82 Cr. 536, E.D.N.Y. EHN). A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 14 to request a hearing on a proposal by Consolidated Natural Gas Company (Consolidated); and CNG Development Company and CNG Producing Company, non-utility subsidiaries, whereby gas leases in the Appalachian region currently held by CNG Producing will be transferred to CNG Development through a two-step transaction consisting of (1) a dividend-in-kind transfer of the properties by CNG Producing to Consolidated, recorded at net book cost, and (2) a simultaneous transfer of the properties to CNG Development by Consolidated in exchange for shares of CNG Development common stock. NOTICE OF FILING AND ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed June 16, 1983 by the American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-83-14) modifying quotation and cover rules to accommodate the introduction of option contracts covering \$1,000,000 and \$100,000 in principal amounts of 13-week U.S. Treasury bills and 10-year Treasury notes, respectively. (Rel. 34-19885)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

On June 17, 1983, the Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the Midwest Securities Trust Company (SR-MSTC-83-2) authorizing MSTC to expand its Municipal

Bond Processing System to provide depository services for eligible municipal securities issues in bearer form. Previously, the System provided depository services only for registered form municipal securities issues. (Rel. 34-19888)
