ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

INITIAL DECISION IN THE MATTER OF BENJAMIN SPRECHER

In an administrative proceeding begun in 1993, Judge Brenda Murray has barred Mr. Benjamin G. Sprecher, a New York attorney, from participating in any offering of penny stock. The U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York found Mr. Sprecher guilty of ten counts which included crimes of conspiracy to sell unregistered securities, conspiracy to make false statements to the Commission and the Internal Revenue Service, perjury, and obstruction of justice in 1992. In 1993, the U.S. District Court for D.C. ordered Mr. Sprecher to disgorge illegal profits and reasonable interest. Mr. Sprecher bought and sold shell corporations which he used with others in illegal activities involving sales of securities to persons in and outside the United States. (Initial Decision Rel. RULE 102(e) PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST LOUIS WEISS, CPA

The Commission instituted proceedings pursuant to Rule 102(e) against Louis R. Weiss, a CPA practicing in Denver, Colorado. Simultaneously, the Commission accepted an offer of settlement in which Weiss consented to the entry of an order, without admitting or denying the findings contained in the order, that bars Weiss from appearing before the Commission as an accountant, but allows him to reapply after five years.

The order for proceedings makes findings that Weiss engaged in improper and unethical professional conduct during his audits of the financial statements of Bion Environmental Technologies, Inc. (Bion) filed in its Form 10-K for 1993 and Form 10-KSB for 1994.

The order also makes findings that these financial statements were materially false and misleading in that they, among other things, overstated assets and revenues, and understated expenses.

The order further makes findings that Weiss failed to perform these audits in conformity with Generally Accepted Auditing Standards and failed to determine that Bion's financial statements were not prepared in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. In addition, the order makes findings that Weiss falsified his audit working papers to make them appear to have been reviewed by a concurring review partner when they had not been (Rel. 34-36949; AAE Rel. 768)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

TWENTIETH CENTURY BLENDED PORTFOLIOS, INC., ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 5 to request a hearing on an application filed by Twentieth Century Blended Portfolios, Inc. (Blended Portfolios), et al. for an order under Sections 6(c) and 17(b) of the Investment Company Act exempting applicants from Sections 12(d)(1) and 17(a) of the Act. The order would permit Blended Portfolios to implement a "fund of funds" arrangement and acquire up to 100% of the voting shares of any Twentieth Century fund. (Rel. IC-21813 - March 11)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The <u>National Securities Clearing Corporation</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-NSCC-96-04) to amend NSCC's rules to establish a mutual fund profile service (MFPS) and to obtain approval for implementation of the daily price and rate file phase of MFPS. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of March 11. (Rel. 34-36942)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change filed by the <u>American Stock Exchange</u> (SR-Amex-95-43) relating to Index Fund Shares. Publication of the approval order is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of March 11. (Rel. 34-36947)
