COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

ANDREW ROTHMAN RESIGNS AS DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS

Chairman John S.R. Shad announced today that Andrew L. Rothman will resign as Director of the Office of Public Affairs in March in order to accept a corporate communications position in California.

Mr. Rothman, 42, joined the Commission as Director of Public Affairs in July 1976. Prior to that he had been a senior staff aide to a U.S. Senator for six years and a newspaper reporter in Ohio, New York and New Jersey for five years.

A native of New York City, Mr. Rothman majored in communications at the American University in Washington and received an MBA degree from Loyola College in Baltimore.

Mr. Rothman will leave the Commission March 16 and will begin work as Director of Corporate Communications for Advanced Micro Devices in Sunnyvale, California on April 2. His successor has not yet been chosen.

IRVING M. EINHORN NAMED ADMINISTRATOR
OF LOS ANGELES REGIONAL OFFICE

Chairman John S.R. Shad announced today the appointment of Irving M. Einhorn to the position of Regional Administrator of the Commission's Los Angeles Regional Office. He succeeds Michael Stewart who resigned to enter the private practice of law.

Mr. Einhorn, 42, joined the staff of the Commission's Chicago Regional Office in 1972. In 1975 he became a branch chief (enforcement) and in 1977 the Senior Trial Counsel for the Chicago Regional Office. In 1980, Mr. Einhorn transferred to the Commission's Headquarters Office in Washington D.C. and became Assistant Chief Trial Attorney with the Division of Enforcement's Trial Unit.

Mr. Einhorn, a native of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania is a graduate of Temple University and Valparaiso University School of Law.

The Los Angeles Region comprises California, Arizona, Nevada, Hawaii and Guam.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

INSIDER AND TIPPEE ENJOINED; DISGORGED PROFITS

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on February 6 Judge Dale E. Saffels, U.S. District Court for the District of Kansas, presiding as a visiting Judge in the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Oklahoma, entered orders: permanently enjoining George Platt of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, from violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934; requiring Stephen B. Platt, also of Oklahoma City, to comply with his undertaking to refrain from violating the anti-fraud provisions of the Exchange Act; and requiring George and Stephen Platt to pay \$16,200 and \$16,000, respectively, into the Registry of the Court within 60 days.

Both Platts consented to the above-mentioned orders without admitting or denying the allegations in the February 1 complaint. The complaint alleged that G. Platt, then Chairman of the Board of Directors and Chief Executive Officer of Texas International Company and also a Director of Phoenix Resources Company, an oil and gas company 52% owned by Texas International, unlawfully purchased shares of Phoenix Resources stock while in possession of material, non-public information concerning the possible liquidation of Phoenix; improperly disclosed such information to two other persons, including his adult son, S. Platt; and failed to report such purchases, as well as an earlier purchase of Phoenix stock, to the Commission as required of officers and directors of public reporting companies. The complaint charged that S. Platt unlawfully purchased shares of Phoenix stock while in possession of such information and while knowing or having reason to know that the information resulted from an improper disclosure by an insider of Phoenix or its parent company. The complaint sought permanent injunctions and disgorgement of the Platts' trading profits from those stock transactions.

This civil action continues as to seven remaining defendants and is set for trial before the Court and an advisory jury in Oklahoma City beginning March 19. (SEC v. George Platt, et al., CA No. 83-225-Sf, W.D. CA). (LR-10282)

E. JACQUES COURTOIS CONSENTS TO INJUNCTION

The New York Regional Office announced that on February 6 a Final Consent Judgment of Permanent Injunction was entered against E. Jacques Courtois, Jr., a former Morgan Stanley & Co. employee, enjoining him from violations of the antifraud provisions. The action follows Courtois' guilty plea to fraud and conspiracy charges. The January 26 complaint alleged that Courtois misappropriated confidential information about impending corporate takeovers and leaked the information to confederates who purchased securities of the target companies. Courtois, in pleading guilty to criminal charges, had already agreed to pay \$150,000 into a fund to reimburse partially the selling investors for their losses. A court-appointed special escrow agent will administer the fund and will submit a distribution plan to the court. (SEC v. E. Jacques Courtois, Jr., 84 Civ. 0593, CSH, SDNY). (LR-10283)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

OVER-THE-COUNTER SECURITIES FUND, INC.

An order has been issued permitting Over-the-Counter Securities Fund, Inc. to implement a proposed deferred compensation plan for its non-interested directors, and granting an exemption from the provisions of Sections 13(a)(2), 18(f)(1), 22(f) and 22(g) of the Investment Company Act in connection with the Plan. (Rel. IC-13758 - Feb. 10)

PACIFIC HORIZON FUNDS, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 6 to request a hearing on an application by Pacific Horizons Funds, Inc., a registered open-end, management investment company, requesting an order to permit it to enter into master repurchase agreements with non-affiliated financial institutions such as broker-dealers and banks under which individual repurchase transactions would be effected. AAA U.S. GOVERNMENT MONEY MARKET ACCOUNT, INC.
