ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

CHARLES D. DIGH CITED

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Charles D. Digh of Lake Charles, Louisiana. Digh was formerly a registered representative at the Lake Charles branch office of a registered broker-dealer.

The Order for Proceedings alleges that from about November 1979 through November 1982, Digh wilfully violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws by: (1) misrepresenting to customers the risks inherent in certain strategies employed in listed options and common stock transactions; (2) misrepresenting to customers the potential profits and rates of return that might be achieved through listed options trading; and (3) engaging in unsuitable options trading for certain customers in view of the customers' financial situations, investment objectives and investment sophistication.

A hearing will be scheduled to take evidence on the allegations against Digh and to afford him an opportunity to present any defenses he may have. The purpose of the hearing is to determine whether the allegations against Digh are true and, if so, what, if any, remedial action would be appropriate in the public interest. (Rel. 34-20781)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COURT FREEZES ASSETS OF ALFRED I. GELLMAN AND CHARLES GELLMAN

The Atlanta Regional and Miami Branch Offices announced that on March 22 Judge Signey M. Aronovitz, U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Florida, entered an order freezing the assets of Alfred I. Gellman (A. Gellman) of Miami Beach, Florida, and his son, Charles Gellman (C. Gellman) of Plantation, Florida, pending payment of disgorgement to the Receiver for Colorado Development Corporation and American Investors Marketing Corporation. In its Motion For A Freeze Of Assets, the Commission claimed that the defendants wrongfully transferred and dissipated at least \$12,917 in contravention of the Court's September 1, 1983 Temporary Restraining Order and Order Freezing Assets.

On September 22, 1983, the defendants, without admitting or denying the facts alleged in the complaint and other moving papers, consented to Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction and Other Relief enjoining them from violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The complaint alleged that the defendants were selling unregistered securities in the form of investment contracts involving the sale of piles of mineral aggregate coupled with an agreement to process the aggregate into gold and silver.

The Order freezing defendants' assets was entered to preserve the possibility of effective relief at the conclusion of the litigation. Previously, A. Gellman was ordered to disgorge an amount of money equal to the total amount of money received from investors in the Glasgow Lode Mineral Aggregate Program. C. Gellman was ordered to disgorge an amount to be set by the Court at a later hearing. Over 125 investors residing throughout the United States invested approximately \$1 million in the Glasgow Lode Mineral Aggregate Program. (SEC v. Colorado Development Corporation, et al., S.D. CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

GEORGE GRIFFIN LEWIS PLEADS GUILTY TO SECURITIES FRAUD

The Atlanta Regional Office and the U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of Mississippi announced that on March 12 George Griffin Lewis pled guilty to one count of criminally violating the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933. The guilty plea was accepted by Chief Judge Dan M. Russell, Jr., U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Mississippi. The criminal information was filed against Lewis on September 30, 1983. Judge Russell sentenced Lewis to one year imprisonment and then suspended the sentence pending Lewis' completion of one year's probation.

Lewis, who was general partner of Lewis & Company, a Jackson, Mississippi broker-dealer, was enjoined on December 21, 1983 from further violations of the antifraud, net capital, customer protection, and books and records provisions of the securities laws by the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Mississippi. He was also barred from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment adviser or investment company in administrative proceedings ordered by the Commission. The injunction was entered and sanctions were imposed under Lewis' consent without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint and of the Order for Public Proceedings.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Chicago Board Options Exchange, Incorporated filed a proposed rule change (SR-CBOE-84-10) that would enable CBOE to establish an Integrated Billing System. The System would collect an exchange member's monthly obligations to the Exchange from that member's designated clearing agent's account with the Options Clearing Corporation. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of April 9. (Rel. 34-20810)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange Incorporated (SR-CBOE-84-12). The rule change will allow CBOE member firms to use CBOE's Order Support System to route electronically to CBOE's limit order book any public customer limit orders for Standard and Poor's Telecommunications Index options. APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-NYSE-84-1) to provide that NYSE stock index options will expire in the four nearest-term months and that series with up to six different expiration months may be listed at any given time. (Rel. 34-20812)

ORDER EXTENDING TEMPORARY STAY

The Commission is extending, until April 30, the temporary stay granted to the Institutional Networks Corporation on August 16, 1983, and extended on November 30, 1983, until March 31, 1984.
