RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

PROPOSAL OF, AND COMMENTS REQUESTED ON, RULE 151

The Commission proposes for public comment Rule 151 under the Securities Act of 1933. The rule would provide a safe harbor for certain types of annuity contracts by defining the term "annuity contract," as used in Section 3(a)(8) of the Securities Act.

AMENDMENT TO RULE 22c-1 AND NEW RULE 22e-2 PROPOSED FOR COMMENT

The Commission proposes for public comment an amendment to Rule 22c-1 and a new Rule 22e-2 under the Investment Company Act of 1940. The proposals would limit the days on which pricing of investment company redeemable securities might be required to customary United States business days and would provide that an investment company will not have suspended the right of redemption if it prices a redemption request under the amended rule.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

TERRENCE E. DREILING RESIGNS FROM PRACTICE BEFORE COMMISSION

The Commission announced the simultaneous institution and settlement of administrative proceedings against Terrence E. Dreiling, a certified public accountant, in which he undertook to resign from practicing or appearing before the Commission as an accountant. The administrative proceedings are based on the entry of a permanent injunction against Dreiling on October 11, 1984. (Rel. 34-21472) [see LR-10598]

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

TERRENCE E. DREILING ENJOINED AND ORDERED TO DISGORGE PROFITS

The Denver Regional Office announced the entry of a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction in the U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado against Terrence E. Dreiling, a certified public accountant in Golden, Colorado. Simultaneously with the filing of the September 25 complaint, Dreiling consented to the Judgment without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations.

The complaint alleges that from 1979 to 1981, while he was chief financial officer of Oiltech, Inc., Dreiling caused the company to file false and misleading documents, and that in 1981, when he was president of Oiltech, he sold Oiltech common stock while in possession of material non-public information. The Judgment enjoins Dreiling from violating the securities laws and orders him to disgorge \$40,000 profits illegally obtained from trading Oiltech stock. (SEC v. Terrence E. Dreiling, D. WILLIAM M. HOLBEN AND ROBERT A. SAVAGE ENJOINED

The Denver Regional Office announced the entry of a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction in the U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado against William M. Holben and Robert A. Savage, both certified public accountants in Denver, Colorado. Simultaneously with the filing of the September 25 complaint, Holben and Savage consented to the Judgment without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations.

The complaint alleges that, by performing the 1980 audit of Oiltech, Inc. without conforming with generally accepted auditing standards, Holben and Savage aided and abetted violations of the securities law by Oiltech. The Judgment enjoins Holben and Savage from appearing or practicing before the Commission, provided they may apply after a minimum of three years if they have met certain educational and peer review requirements. (SEC v. William M. Holben and Robert A. Savage, D. CO, Civil Action No. 84-M-1903). (LR-10599) [see LR-10598]

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

SEVEN STAR PARTNERS, LTD.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 14 to request a hearing on an application filed by Seven Star Partners, Ltd., a Florida limited partnership formed primarily to participate in the distribution of seven motion pictures through a limited partnership interest in Warner Bros. Seven Distributing Company, a California limited partnership, for an order exempting it from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-14242 - Nov. 19)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing New England Power Company, subsidiary of New England Electric System, to extend the period in which it may incur short term indebtedness from March 31, 1985 through December 31, 1987. (Rel. 35-23484 - Nov. 19)

ASSOCIATED NATURAL GAS COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 13 to request a hearing on a proposal by Associated Natural Gas Company, subsidiary of Arkansas Power & Light Company and of Middle South Utilities, to issue and sell to a bank its unsecured promissory notes in an amount not to exceed \$3 million at any one time outstanding from time to time for up to one year from the effective date of an order in this proceeding. JERSEY CENTRAL POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Jersey Central Power & Light Company, subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corporation, to acquire up to \$2 million of notes issued by customers for financing certain conservation measures during the period ending December 31, 1989. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the New York Stock Exchange. The rule change (SR-NYSE-84-33) modifies NYSE's securities listing standards to permit NYSE listed companies to act in a dual capacity as transfer agent and registrar for their own securities or to appoint qualified organizations, including but not limited to unaffiliated banks and trust companies, to act in a dual capacity as transfer agent and registrar. TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

UNION PACIFIC CORPORATION

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on an application by Union Pacific Corporation that the trusteeship of Citibank, N.A. under certain specified indentures is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify Citibank from acting as trustee.
