RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

ADOPTION OF RULE 0-11 AND CONFORMING AMENDMENTS

The Commission has issued a release announcing the adoption of Rule 0-11 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and conforming amendments relating to the imposition and collection of filing fees for certain Exchange Act business combination transactions. The amendments codify administrative practice with respect to 1983 legislative amendments to the Exchange Act that require payment to the Commission of a filing fee calculated on a percentage basis of a transaction's value for tender offers and proxy and information statements involving an acquisition, merger, consolidation or sale or other dispositions of substantially all the assets of a company and certain other filings. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CUMBERLAND INVESTMENT CORP., ET AL. ORDERED TO SHOW CAUSE

The Boston Regional Office announced that on December 18, 1985 Judge William G. Young, U.S. District Court for the District of Massachusetts, entered an Order to Show Cause why Cumberland Investment Corporation and Harold F. Chorney should not be held in civil contempt for their failure to comply with the Court's order to produce documents responsive to subpoenas issued to them. The subpoenas were issued in conjunction with the Commission's investigation of potential violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws by Cumberland, Chorney and others in the offer and sale of securities in the form of investment contracts, namely, silver dollar investments with a 15% per annum repurchase guarantee. The contempt hearing is scheduled for January 15. (SEC v. Cumberland Investment Corporation and Harold F. Chorney, D.C. Mass. 85-3308-Y) (LR-10973)

**FLUID LIFT INTERNATIONAL, INC.
PERMANENTLY ENJOINED**

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on December 18, 1985, the Honorable David O. Belew of the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas permanently enjoined Fluid Lift International, Inc. (Fluid Lift), a publicly-held company located in Fort Worth, Texas from further violations of the registration and anti-fraud provisions of the federal securities laws. Fluid Lift consented to the injunction without admitting or denying the violations alleged in the November 4, 1984 complaint.

The complaint alleges that from November 1981 through at least June 1985, Fluid Lift, its founder and chairman, J.B. Walling (Walling) and The Cadasco Trust, Fluid Lift's largest shareholder, offered and sold to the public approximately 1.8 million shares of Fluid Lift's common stock for approximately \$2 million in violation of the registration provisions of the securities laws. It is further alleged that at the same time Fluid Lift and Walling violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws by making false and misleading statements to the public concerning, among other things, projections of Fluid Lift's future revenues and the present stage of development of its pumping system. GEORGE W. RIDENOUR, JR. SENTENCED TO 20 YEARS

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on December 23, 1985, U.S. District Judge William O. Bertelsman of the Eastern District of Kentucky sentenced George W. Ridenour, Jr. (Ridenour), former general counsel and director of the failed United American Bank in Knoxville, Tennessee (UABK), to 20 years imprisonment on six counts involving conspiracy, filing false tax returns and assisting Jacob F. Butcher (Butcher), former UABK chairman and chief executive officer, in filing false tax returns. A guilty verdict was returned against Ridenour by a federal jury on November 26, 1985, on six counts of a 17-count indictment.

Orders of permanent injunction were entered against Ridenour and Butcher on November 6, 1985, and January 3, 1985, respectively, in an injunctive action brought by the Commission on November 9, 1984. Summary judgment was granted for the Commission and against the remaining defendant, Jesse Barr, Butcher's banking consultant, and a permanent injunction was entered as to Mr. Barr on November 15, 1985. Defendants Butcher and Barr are currently serving federal prison sentences of 20 and 18 years, respectively, for bank fraud and other crimes. Ridenour is scheduled to report to federal prison authorities by February 1, 1986. (SEC v. Jacob F. Butcher, et al., E.D. Ark., CA No. LR-C-84-942) (LR-10975)

COMPLAINT NAMES NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION, U.S.A., INC.

The Commission announced on January 9, 1986 that it has filed a complaint in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against The National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Inc., seeking an injunction and other equitable relief based upon violations of the securities registration provisions of the federal securities laws resulting from sales of interests in a retirement plan offered to lay members of the Convention and others. Without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint, the Convention consented to a permanent injunction and certain other equitable relief, including rescission of payments.

The complaint alleges, among other things, that under the retirement plan, which was to go into effect upon the receipt of \$300,000,000 by the Convention, participants pay \$300 in return for which they will purportedly receive \$1,000 per month for life upon reaching 70 years of age, and upon death a second beneficiary receives payments for life. It was alleged that the retirement plan was actuarially unsound. It was alleged that the retirement plan interests constitute securities in the form of certificates of interest and participations in a profit-sharing agreement and constitute investment contracts. (SEC v. The National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Inc., USDC DC, CA No. 86-51) (LR-10977)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE ADVANTAGE GOVERNMENT SECURITIES FUND

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until January 30, 1986 to request a hearing on an application filed by The Advantage Government Securities Fund, The Advantage Income Fund, The Advantage Growth Fund and The Advantage Concept Fund (Applicants), requesting an order of the Commission, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act, exempting Applicants from the provisions of Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 22(c) and 22(d) of the Act and Rules 22c-1 and 22d-1 thereunder to the ex-

tent necessary to permit Applicants to impose a contingent deferred sales load on certain redemptions of their shares and waive or credit such load in certain instances and pursuant to Section 11(a) of the Act permitting certain exchanges of shares of Applicants. (Rel. IC-14889)

FINANCIERE CREDIT SUISSE--FIRST BOSTON AND FINANCIERE, INC.

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting Financiere Credit Suisse--First Boston and Financiere, Inc. from all provisions of the Act in connection with their proposed issuance of debt securities in the United States. (Rel. IC-14888)
