U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST CENTRUST SAVINGS BANK

The Commission today instituted public administrative proceedings against CentTrust Savings Bank and accepted an offer of settlement in which CentTrust consented to a Commission order without admitting or denying the Order's statements of fact or findings.

The Commission's order finds that CentTrust violated certain beneficial ownership reporting provisions of the securities laws by failing to disclose in a Schedule 13D amendment that CentTrust's Federal Home Loan Bank Board supervisory agent had, in January 1985, ordered CentTrust to cease purchasing securities of MassMutual Mortgage and Realty Investors, and, by failing to disclose promptly in a Schedule 13D amendment in February 1985, that the supervisory agent had ordered CentTrust to divest itself of two-thirds of its MassMutual holdings.

CentTrust was ordered to comply with the provisions of the securities laws which the order found had been violated. (Rel. 34-23076)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

SUBPOENA ENFORCEMENT ACTION INITIATED IN STOCK TRADING INVESTIGATION

The Seattle Regional Office and John E. Lamp, U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Washington, announced the filing of a subpoena enforcement action on March 12 to compel Thomas H. Hornick to produce certain documents in connection with an ongoing investigation into trading in the stock of Sunset Minerals, Inc., incorporated in the state of Washington. Hornick has been ordered to appear and show cause in this matter before Judge Justin L. Quackenbush on April 18. (SEC v. Thomas Hornick, File No. C86-154-JLQ, USDC EDWA). (LR-11039)

CAPITAL FACILITIES CORPORATION NAMED IN COMPLAINT

The Commission filed a civil injunctive action on March 27 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Capital Facilities Corporation of Dayton, Ohio. The complaint alleges violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws and seeks a Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief.

The Commission alleges that Capital, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct extending over several years, failed to file its Quarterly Report on Form 10-Q for its fiscal quarter ended January 31, 1986, filed late annual and quarterly reports, failed to file Notifications of Late Filing, and failed for several years to register its common stock under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Commission requests that the Court order Capital to file its delinquent quarterly report and enjoin it from further violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. Capital Facilities Corporation, USDC DC, Civil Action No. 86-0826). (LR-11041)

BALDWIN FORMER CFO SETTLES INJUNCTIVE ACTION

The Commission announced today that Timothy P. Hartman, former Chief Financial Officer of Baldwin-United Corporation, settled the Commission's enforcement action against him by a Stipulation of Settlement and Final Order as to Timothy P. Hartman (Order) that was entered on March 25 by the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Ohio in Cincinnati. In the Stipulation of Settlement, Hartman undertook not to violate the periodic reporting and internal accounting controls provisions of the Securities Exchange Act and Rules 12b-20, 13a-1, and 13a-13. The Order requires him to comply with his undertakings and to continue to provide discovery and appear for testimony if requested by the Commission.

Hartman had been sued last September for violation of the securities laws in connection with the preparation of Baldwin's financial statements and internal accounting controls. The litigation remains pending against Morley Thompson, Baldwin's former Chief Executive Officer. (SEC v. Baldwin-United Corporation, et al, Civil Action No. C-1-85-1581, SDOH). (LR-11042)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

WILLIAM RUBIN SENTENCED

Francis X. Hermann, U.S. Attorney for the District of Minnesota, and the Chicago Regional Office announced that on March 17 U.S. District Court Judge Donald Alsop sentenced William Rubin, former Chairman and Chief Executive of Flight Transportation Corporation, to 35 years imprisonment. Rubin was convicted after a six-week jury trial of violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and making untrue statements of material fact and omitting to state material facts in a registration statement filed with the Commission in connection with Flight's 1982 securities offering. These misstatements concerned, among other things, Flight's business operations, income and assets. A Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction was previously entered against Rubin in a civil injunctive proceeding instituted by the Commission. Rubin had previously turned over to Flight's Receiver assets frozen in the Commission's injunctive action, including cash in excess of \$1,240,000. (U.S. v. William Mark Rubin, et al., USDC DMN, Criminal No. 3-85-27). (LR-11038)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

BANCO CENTRAL, S.A.

An order has been issued exempting Banco Central, S.A. and certain United States subsidiaries thereof from all provisions of the Investment Company Act in connection with their proposed issuance of commercial paper and other debt securities in the United States. (Rel. IC-15015 - March 26)

SWINK & COMPANY, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 5 to request a hearing on an application filed by Swink & Company, Inc. and Jimmy Dale Swink for a permanent order exempting them from the provisions of Section 9(a) of the Investment Company Act. As provided by Rule 0-5 of the Rules and Regulations of the Investment Company Act, an order disposing of the application will be issued as of course following said date unless the Commission thereafter orders a hearing upon request or upon its own motion. CNA GROWTH STOCK FUND, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 21 to request a hearing on applications filed by CNA Growth Stock Fund, Inc. and CNA Bond Fund, Inc. for an order declaring that they have ceased to be investment companies. (Rel. IC-15017 - March 27)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change filed by the American Stock Exchange (SR-Amex-86-8) to extend the pilot program for the automatic execution of certain Major Market Index options for an additional three-month period, until June 6, 1986. In addition, the number of series included in the automatic execution system will be increased from four to six (three put and three calls). (Rel. 34-23063)

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The American Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-Amex-86-6) to modify its listing requirements for foreign issuers. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of March 31. (Rel. 34-23064)

Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
