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## COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

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### COMMISSION'S OFFICE IN PHILADELPHIA, PENNSYLVANIA DESIGNATED AS A REGIONAL OFFICE

As previously announced, the Washington Regional Office has been relocated to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and will now be known as the Philadelphia Regional Office. ### DELEGATIONS OF AUTHORITY TO DIRECTOR OF DIVISION OF CORPORATION FINANCE AND REGIONAL ADMINISTRATORS

The Commission delegated to the Director of the Division of Corporation Finance the authority to waive the disqualification provisions of Regulation D under the Securities Act of 1933. In addition, the present delegation of authority to the Regional Administrators with regard to confidential treatment applications under the Securities Act has been extended so that they may under certain circumstances deny such applications. 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## TRADING SUSPENSIONS

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### TRADING SUSPENDED IN FIRST HOUSTON CAPITAL RESOURCES FUND, INC.

The Commission announced the temporary suspension of over-the-counter trading in the securities of First Houston Capital Resources Fund, Inc., a Utah corporation with executive offices in Fort Worth, Texas, for a single ten-day period beginning at noon (EDT) on May 19 and terminating at midnight (EDT) on May 28.

The Commission temporarily suspended trading in the company's securities because of the lack of current financial statements and in view of questions that have been raised concerning the adequacy of publicly disseminated information regarding the valuation of the company's assets in such financial statements as are currently being disseminated.

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## **CIVIL PROCEEDINGS**

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TIME ENERGY SYSTEMS, INC., OTHERS ENJOINED;  
OTHER RELIEF ORDERED

The U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia entered Final Judgments on May 20 permanently enjoining Time Energy Systems, Inc., of Houston, Texas, its President and two former officers from violating antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and violating or aiding and abetting violations of the periodic reporting provision of the Exchange Act. Two of the individual defendants were also enjoined from making misrepresentations to accountants. In its complaint, the Commission alleged that Time Energy's financial statements as of and for the third quarter of its 1983 fiscal year and subsequent periods through and including the third quarter of its 1985 fiscal year were materially false and misleading due to the improper recognition of revenue on certain transactions and failure to make certain disclosures. The District Court ordered Time Energy to restate those financial statements. The District Court also ordered Time Energy's President to comply with certain undertakings. The defendants consented to the Final Judgments without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint. (SEC v. Time Energy Systems, Inc., et al., USDC DC, Civil Action No. 86-1370). (LR-11106)

PERMANENT INJUNCTION ENTERED  
AGAINST HERBERT M. KIRSCHNER

The Boston Regional Office announced that on April 30 an Order of Permanent Injunction was entered against Herbert M. Kirschner by Judge T.F. Gilroy Daly, U.S. District Court for the District of Connecticut. The Order was entered in connection with a complaint filed on April 23. Kirschner consented to the Order without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations.

The complaint alleged that: (1) Kirschner violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and aided and abetted violations of certain registration provisions of the Investment Company Act of 1940; (2) from at least April 1982 to at least July 1984, Kirschner offered and sold over \$1.8 million in promissory notes issued by an unregistered investment company of which he was a principal, HMK Management Corp., to at least 70 persons residing in four states; and (3) despite representations that monies invested would not be placed at risk through direct investment, investors' funds were dissipated by direct investments in index futures and stock options and disbursements to pay Kirschner's personal expenses, HMK's business expenses and other personal business ventures controlled by Kirschner. 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### CONSOLIDATED NATURAL GAS COMPANY; POTOMAC EDISON COMPANY

Notices have been issued giving interested persons until June 9 to request a hearing on a proposal by the following under the same release: Consolidated Natural Gas Company - a registered holding company, and its subsidiaries, Consolidated Natural Gas Service Company, Inc., CNG Coal Company, CNG Energy Company, CNG Research Company, The Peoples Natural Gas Company, Consolidated Gas Transmission Corporation, Consolidated System LNG Company, CNG Producing Company, West Ohio Gas Company, The River Gas Company, Hope Gas, Inc. and Union National Center West. Consolidated and its subsidiary propose to establish a System Money Pool to be administered by Consolidated Natural Gas Service Company Inc. for the purpose of providing loans on a short-term basis to those participants, other than Consolidated, who have a need for short-term funds. Excess funds will be invested and earnings allocated among those participants providing such excess funds; and Potomac Edison Company - subsidiary of Allegheny Power Company, to issue and sell prior to December 31, 1986 up to \$30 million of new preferred stock, in one or more series, each series to have a par value of \$100 per share. Potomac proposes to sell the stock either by competitive bidding or, subject to authorization by the Commission by further order, by private placement with institutional investors or by negotiations with underwriters.
