RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

PROPOSAL TO ADOPT AMENDMENTS TO RULE 3a12-8

The Commission is soliciting comments on proposed amendments to Rule 3a12-8 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Rule designates certain government debt securities as exempt securities for purposes of the Exchange Act's application to the marketing in the United States of futures contracts on these securities. The proposal would eliminate the Rule's current requirement that such futures contracts must be traded by boards of trade located in the country which issued the underlying foreign government securities to be entitled to the exemption.

AMENDMENT TO RULE 3a12-8 ADOPTED

The Commission adopted an amendment to Rule 3a12-8 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 that exempts Japanese government securities from the provisions of the Exchange Act for purposes of marketing futures contracts on these securities in the United States. (Rel. 34-23423)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST JOHN GIURA, OTHERS

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings against John Giura, a former partner of Stein Roe & Farnham, a registered investment adviser, George Inserra and John Inserra, formerly employed by Shearson Lehman Bros. Inc. as registered representatives, and Nicholas J. Gentile, manager of Shearson's Utica branch office. The Order for Proceedings alleges that Giura, the Inserras and Gentile violated and aided and abetted violations of the antifraud provisions of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

The Order alleges that: Giura directed Stein Roe's clients brokerage commissions to be credited to certain registered representatives so that they could make payments to certain individuals who Giura believed could introduce new business to Stein Roe; Giura allowed the Inserras to engage in a scheme in which they purchased securities in a holding account; if the price of the security rose, the Inserras transferred it to their retail clients, if the price of the security declined, it was transferred to a Stein Roe advisory client account; and Gentile knew or should have known of the scheme.

A hearing will be held to determine whether the allegations are true and what remedial action is necessary in the public interest. (Rel. IA-1028)

STEPHEN S. YORK BARRED; STEPHEN S. YORK WORLD WIDE INVESTMENTS, INC. SANCTIONED

The Commission barred Stephen S. York from association in any capacity with any broker or dealer, investment adviser, investment company or municipal securities dealer, and revoked the registration of Stephen S. York World Wide Investments, Inc. as a broker-dealer. Both the bar and revocation were imposed by default. The Order found, among other things, that: (1) York World Wide was permanently enjoined on February 6, 1986

from future violations of Section 15(c)(3), 17(a) and 17(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 15c3-1, 15c3-3 and 17a-11; and (2) York World Wide wilfully violated and York wilfully aided and abetted violations of the net capital, customer reserve, early warning and access to books and records provisions of the Exchange Act. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

FINAL CONSENT JUDGMENT ENTERED AGAINST HOWARD HARLOW

The New York Regional Office announced that on June 27 Judge Milton Pollack, U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, entered a Final Consent Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Howard Harlow, president and a principal of Whale & Co., Inc., a registered broker-dealer. The Final Judgment enjoins Harlow from violating the antifraud provisions of the securities laws and orders disgorgement of \$50,000. All monies have been placed in the Court's custody pending future application by the Commission for the disbursement of such proceeds. Harlow consented to the Final Judgment without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint.

The January 9, 1986 complaint alleges that Harlow traded and caused certain customers to trade in Puritan Fashions Corporation stock while in possession of material non-public information concerning Puritan's declining earnings and sales.

Pursuant to the Order for Disgorgement, Harlow consents to disgorge \$50,000, which represents all personal profits made on short sales as well as a portion of customers' profits and avoided losses, plus brokerage commissions on such trades.

The action is continuing against Ronald Hengen, the only remaining defendant. (SEC v. Ronald Hengen, et al., 86 Civ. 306 [MP], SDNY). (LR-11153)

CIVIL CONTEMPT SENTENCE

The Commission announced on June 19 the incarceration of Vernon Hulme, of Fort Worth, by Federal District Court Judge G. Kendall Sharp of Orlando, Florida. Hulme was found in civil contempt of a preliminary injunction entered against him in SEC v. Securities Transfer, Inc., et al. requiring him to freeze \$950,000 in assets. Judge Sharp found that Hulme did not own the asset he had claimed to have frozen, an interest in a gemstone collection. Hulme was ordered to serve no more than six months in prison and can be released earlier if he identifies and freezes another asset, satisfactory to the Commission, worth \$950,000. (SEC v. Securities Transfer, Inc., et al., USDC MDFL, Orlando Division, Civil Action No. 85-1049-CIV-ORL). (LR-11154)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

LAZARD-SPECIAL EQUITY FUND, INC.

An order has been issued permitting the proposed purchase and sale of securities between Lazard Special Equity Fund, Inc. and a limited partnership and an individual account also advised by the Fund's investment adviser. (Rel. IC-15191 - July 3)

WASHINGTON AREA GROWTH FUND; FIRST INVESTORS HIGH YIELD FUND, INC.

Orders have been issued declaring that Washington Area Growth Fund and First Investors High Yield Fund, Inc. have ceased to be investment companies. (Rel. IC-15192; IC-15194 - July 8)

SEQUOIA FUND, INC.

An order has been issued permitting a deferred compensation plan for certain directors by Sequoia Fund, Inc. (Rel. IC-15193 - July 8)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

JERSEY CENTRAL POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 28 to request a hearing on a proposal by Jersey Central Power & Light Company, subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corporation. Jersey Central proposes to issue and sell for cash, from time to time through December 31, 1987: (1) additional first mortgage bonds (New Bonds) in an aggregate principal amount of up to \$100 million with a term of 10 to 30 years; and (2) additional shares of cumulative preferred stock (New Preferred Stock) having an aggregate stated value of up to \$100 million. The total principal amount of New Bonds and stated value of New Preferred Stock will not exceed an aggregate of \$150 million. (Rel. 35-24143 - July 3)

NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC TRANSMISSION CORPORATION

An order has been issued authorizing New England Electric Transmission Corporation, subsidiary of New England Electric System, to enter into a line of credit through June 30, 1988, providing for short-term borrowings, to be repaid in less than one year from the date thereof, up to an aggregate amount outstanding (not including borrowings to be repaid with new borrowings) of \$5 million. (Rel. 35-24144 - July 9)
