## RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

### COMMENT PERIOD EXTENDED ON PROPOSED GUIDE FOR PREPARATION OF REGISTRATION STATEMENTS RELATING TO INTERESTS IN REAL ESTATE LIMITED PARTNERSHIPS

The comment period on the Commission's proposal to adopt Guide 60, "Preparation of Registration Statements Relating to Interests in Real Estate Limited Partnerships," of the Guides for Preparation and Filing of Registration Statements under the Securities Act of 1933 (Rel. 33-5465) has been extended from April 15 to May 15, 1974. Comments should refer to File No. S7-517. Proposed Guide 60 sets forth certain comments and suggestions which have been developed by the Division of Corporation Finance in its processing of such registration statements. (Rel. 33-5481)

## COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

### NOTICE OF PROPOSED NATIONAL STOCK EXCHANGE PLAN TO REGULATE FLOOR TRADING

The Commission announced today that the National Stock Exchange (NSE) has filed with the Commission, and is attempting to qualify, a plan to regulate floor trading activities of its members, so that those activities may be classified as "public securities business" for purposes of Securities Exchange Act Rule 19b-2. Subsection (a) of Rule 19b-2 states that an exchange member will be deemed to have such a purpose if at least 80% of the value of his exchange securities transactions over a six month period have been effected for or with persons other than affiliated persons or have been effected pursuant to certain specified types of transaction considered beneficial to the market. Transactions effected in conformity with a "plan designed to eliminate floor trading activities which are not beneficial to the market" which has been declared effective by the Commission fall within this category. The provisions of the NSE plan are similar to the floor trading plans of the New York Stock Exchange (NYSE) and the American Stock Exchange (Amex), which were published for comment in Securities Exchange Act Releases No. 7290 and 7374, respectively, and amended in Release No. 7375. The NSE plan would provide for lower minimum net capital requirements than do the NYSE or Amex plans.

COMPLAINT NAMES AMERICAN SHIP BUILDING CO.,  
GEORGE M. STEINBRENNER, III

The SEC today announced the filing of a complaint in the U. S. District Court for the District of Columbia to enjoin American Ship Building Company and its chief executive officer, George M. Steinbrenner, III, from violations of the reporting and proxy provisions of the securities laws.

In essence, the Commission's complaint alleges that the defendants filed and caused to be filed with the Commission, annual reports and proxy statements for the years 1970 to date which were false and misleading in that they did not disclose that corporate funds were being used for contributions to political campaigns.

The Commission's complaint also seeks certain ancillary relief, including the appointment of a special master to inquire into and examine books and records of American Ship Building in order to render a correct accounting of the company's financial position to the Court and the company's shareholders, and to report all corporate funds which may have been used in political campaigns.
