DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

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ARTHUR ANDERSEN & CO. CENSURED

The SEC announced today that it had accepted an offer of Arthur Andersen & Co. to consent to an order censuring it and to the publication of Findings and an Opinion by the Commission. In proceedings brought pursuant to Rule 2(e) of the Commission's Rules of Practice, respondent Arthur Andersen was charged with failure to disclose fully the facts relating to a settlement negotiated between Whittaker Corporation and Arthur Andersen, Whittaker's auditor, which arose out of an audit performed by Arthur Andersen on the inventory of a Whittaker subsidiary. In its opinion, the Commission found that incomplete disclosure had occurred concerning the settlement. Arthur Andersen consented to the order without admitting or denying the allegations, findings or conclusions of the Commission. (Rel. 33-5512)

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

CAMPEAU CORPORATION

An order has been issued granting the application of Campeau Corporation, a Canadian corporation, under Section 12(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 for an exemption from the provisions of Sections 12(g), 13, 14, 15(d) and 16 of the Exchange Act. The exemption is subject to conditions and will remain in effect so long as: (a) Campeau has fewer than 300 shareholders resident in the United States; and (b) Campeau files with the Commission all of the reports which it is required under the laws of the Province of Ontario to distribute to its shareholders or to submit to the Ontario Securities Commission.

It appeared to the Commission that the requested exemption is not inconsistent with the public interest or protection of investors since Campeau has only 23 shareholders who are resident in the United States; the 23 shareholders will be receiving reports distributed under the laws of the Province of Ontario; the requirement for reports filed pursuant to Section 15(d) of the Act would subject Campeau to the burden of compliance with the accounting principles and practices of two countries; and a trading market in the United States for the securities of Campeau does not exist and that development of such a market is unlikely. TRADING SUSPENSIONS

COMMONWEALTH NATIONAL REALTY TRUST SUSPENDED

Over-the-counter trading in securities of Commonwealth National Realty Trust (the "Trust") of Baltimore, Maryland has been suspended for the period from July 5 through July 14, 1974. Trading had previously been suspended from June 25 through July 4, 1974.

The new suspension was initiated at the request of the Trust in order to permit additional time to assess the effect upon its financial position of the petition for reorganization under Chapter X of the Federal Bankruptcy Act filed by the Commonwealth Corp., the Trust's sponsor, and to permit the Trust to make a more definitive public statement regarding its position and thereby clarify any misconceptions that may have resulted from confusing the identities of Commonwealth Corp. and the Trust. The SEC has announced the suspension of exchange and over-the-counter trading in the securities of BBI, Inc., and over-the-counter trading in the securities of Niccoa Corp. for the further ten-day period July 8 - 17, inclusive.

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

INDIANA & MICHIGAN ELECTRIC COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Indiana & Michigan Electric Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to sell up to \$75 million of short-term notes to additional banks. (Rel. 35-18479)

APPALACHIAN POWER COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Appalachian Power Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to sell up to \$80 million of short-term notes to additional banks. (Rel. 35-18480)

AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing American Electric Power Company, Inc., a registered holding company, to sell up to \$20 million of short-term notes to an additional bank. (Rel. 35-18481)

OHIO POWER COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Ohio Power Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company Inc., to sell up to \$75 million of short-term notes to additional banks. (Rel. 35-18482)

KENTUCKY POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Kentucky Power Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to sell up to \$15 million of short-term notes to banks. (Rel. 35-18483)

NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY

An order has been issued approving an amended plan of National Fuel Gas Company of New York, New York, and three of its subsidiary companies. Under the plan (1) all of the public-utility distribution properties and operations of the subsidiaries will be transferred to a newly-organized company, NFG Gas Corporation, whereupon (2) the three subsidiaries will merge so that the surviving corporation, to be named National Fuel Gas Supply Corporation, will own all of the non-utility (interstate transmission, gas storage, etc.) properties of the merging companies. The publicly-held debentures and common stock of National Fuel Company will remain outstanding without change. (Rel. 35-18484)
