OPEN MEETING - WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 16, 1989 - 10:00 a.m.

The subject matter of the August 16 open meeting will be:

(1) Consideration of whether to issue a release proposing amendments to the Net Capital Rule. The absolute minimum net capital required of registered broker-dealers under Securities Exchange Act Rule 15c3-1 would be raised. In addition, the deductions (haircuts) applied to broker-dealers' equity securities positions in calculating net capital would be standardized under the proposal. Last, the amendments would establish a uniform haircut for stripped and zero coupon bonds and relieve certain aggregate indebtedness charges. FOR FURTHER INFORMATION, PLEASE CONTACT David I.A. (2) Consideration of whether to adopt Rule 15c2-6 (the Penny Stock Fraud Rule), which would impose sales practice requirements on broker-dealers who recommend purchases of certain low-priced, non-NASDAQ over-the-counter securities to persons other than established customers. Such broker-dealers would be required to make a documented suitability determination for the purchaser, and to obtain the purchaser's written agreement to the first three purchases of these securities. (3) Consideration of whether to publish for comment a release revising proposals to amend the Commission's rules and forms regarding the filing of ownership reports by officers, directors, and principal shareholders and the exemption of certain transactions by those persons from the short-swing profit recovery provisions of Section 16 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. (4) Consideration of whether to issue a release for comment proposing amendments to transactional disclosure requirements to enhance shareholder analysis of corporate control transactions recommended or approved by the board of directors. Proposed amendments to Rule 13e-3 and Schedule 13E-3 would ensure that the purposes of the rule are met in all going private transactions in which management has a significant interest. The proposals also would impose a new disclosure requirement, modeled on the structure and interpretive positions of Rule 13e-3, for issuers engaged in extraordinary corporate transactions. Recommendations to reject a tender offer also would be subject to new disclosure requirements under certain circumstances. These additional disclosure requirements would be implemented by adding a new Item 703 to Regulation S-K. The Commission also will consider whether to propose amendments to Rule 14e-2 regarding the obligation of the issuer to respond promptly to revised tender offers. In addition, the Commission will consider whether to propose a procedure by which exhibits would be filed in connection with preliminary and definitive proxy materials. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CIVIL INJUNCTIVE ACTION FILED AGAINST DENNIS W. EVANS

The Commission filed an injunctive action on August 9 in the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California alleging that Dennis W. Evans violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 in connection with transactions involving Ultrasystems, Inc. securities.

The Commission alleges that from mid-September through October 29, 1987, Ultrasystems executives had numerous discussions and meetings at Ultrasystems offices concerning a planned merger with Hadson Corporation. On or before October 28, 1987, Evans overheard a conversation between two Ultrasystems executives concerning the merger. While in possession of this material nonpublic information, Evans had a friend open a brokerage account and purchase shares of Ultrasystems stock on Evans' behalf. Evans recommended that his friend buy some stock for himself, and also, directly or indirectly, recommended the stock to his mother-in-law.

The Commission seeks an order permanently enjoining Evans from violating the antifraud provisions, disgorgement of his profits and those of the individuals to whom he recommended the stock, and payment of an Insider Trading Sanctions Act penalty. COMPLAINT NAMES RAYMOND DADDARIO, JR.

The Boston Regional Office filed a Complaint on July 31 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Connecticut against Raymond F. Daddario, Jr., seeking to permanently enjoin him from future violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5, and seeking disgorgement of \$11,490 in profits and payment of an Insider Trading Sanctions Act penalty of \$11,490. The Complaint alleged that, during July 1986, defendant purchased stock in Coastal Savings Bank while in possession of material nonpublic information relating to a proposed merger between Suffield Savings Bank and Coastal. Simultaneously, and without admitting or denying the allegations, Daddario consented to the relief sought. (SEC v. Raymond F. Daddario, Jr., DCT, Civil Action No. H89-477-AHN). (LR-12202)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

JEFFREY E. GALLAGHER AND ALAN D. TIGNER SENTENCED

The Boston Regional Office and the U.S. Attorney for the District of Massachusetts announced that on July 25 two former stockbrokers, Jeffrey E. Gallagher of Agawam, Massachusetts, and Alan D. Tigner of Northampton, Massachusetts, were sentenced on charges relating to a scheme to defraud customers and their employer. Gallagher was sentenced to 15 months in prison after a guilty plea to one count of mail fraud and three counts of interstate transportation of stolen property. Tigner received a one year suspended sentence, two years probation, and was ordered to do 200 hours of community service after pleading guilty to one count of interstate transportation of stolen property.

In connection with their scheme, customers of the broker-dealer lost \$271,914.20 from unauthorized trades, and defendants cashed customers checks in excess of \$200,000, converting the proceeds to their own use. (U.S. v. Jeffrey E. Gallagher and Alan D. Tigner, DMA, No. 89-30014-F). (LR-12201)
