## NEW RULES AND RULE PROPOSALS

**PROPOSAL TO AMEND REGULATION S-X.** The SEC today announced a proposal to revise Articles, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 9, 11 and Rules 12-01 to 16 (exclusive of 12-06A), and to omit Rules 12-17 and 12-32, of Regulation S-X. The proposal, which would effect the first general revision of these sections of Regulation S-X since 1950, reflects changes in accounting and auditing terminology, procedures and practices that have occurred over the years. Changes are also proposed to clarify, simplify and strengthen the rules and instructions.

All interested persons are invited to submit comments on the proposals in writing to the Office of Chief Accountant, SEC, Washington, D. C. 20549, on or before October 1, 1971. (Release 33-5177)

## DECISION IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDING

**SANCTIONS IMPOSED ON HOLMAN R. WILSON.** The SEC has issued an order imposing remedial sanctions on Holman R. Wilson of Louisville, Ky., former president of a registered broker-dealer. The Commission's order censured Wilson, suspended him from association with any broker-dealer for 30 days effective August 23, 1971, and provided that Wilson may not be associated thereafter with any broker-dealer in a supervisory capacity without the Commission's prior approval.

According to the Commission's decision, Wilson aided and abetted violations of the hypothecation, record-keeping and reporting provisions of the securities laws, and failed to exercise reasonable supervision over persons under his control with a view to preventing such violations.

The Commission's findings and order was based on Wilson's consent in an offer of settlement submitted by him in which he neither admitted nor denied the allegations against him. (Release 34-9291)

## COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTION

**SEC COMPLAINT NAMES MANOR NURSING CENTERS, OTHERS.** The SEC New York Regional Office today announced the filing of a complaint in the Federal Court in New York seeking to enjoin violations of the antifraud and other provisions of the Federal securities laws in the offer and sale of securities of Manor Nursing Centers, Inc., Tenafly, N.J., pursuant to a registration statement which became effective December 8, 1969. Manor Nursing Centers, Inc., Capital Cities Nursing Centers, Inc., (which in July 1970 succeeded to all the business and operations of Manor); Ira Feinberg, president of Manor; Ivan Ezrine, special counsel for the offering; Benjamin Werner & Co., a New York broker-dealer which served as underwriter for the issue; Benjamin Werner, the owner of Benjamin Werner & Co., Glendale, Inc., Atlantic Services, Inc., Arthur Sutton, Samuel Feinberg, Suzanne Marnane and Gladys Halford who together with Ira Feinberg, offered 100,000 shares of Manor common stock owned by them pursuant to the registration statement; and Christos Netelkos, Method Leasing Corp., Upton Corp., and Deneso Corp., Joseph Delmonico, Richard Naiman and Manor Construction Co.

The court order temporarily restrained defendants from violations of the anti-fraud provisions and froze all funds paid to the defendants in connection with the Manor public offering, pending determination whether the requested injunction should be granted. Argument is scheduled on the Commission's motion for preliminary injunction, order of disgorgement of defendants' profits from the Manor public offering and appointment of a trustee for August 19. ## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

**WALT DISNEY.** The SEC has issued a notice under the Holding Company Act giving interested persons until September 14 to request a hearing upon an application of Walt Disney Productions (Productions), Burbank, Calif. for exemption from all provisions of the Act. Walt Disney World, an entertainment and recreation complex near Orlando, Fla., is being developed by wholly-owned subsidiaries of Productions. Productions proposes to organize a wholly-owned subsidiary utility company in Florida for the sole purpose of providing electric energy, natural gas and other utilities to the Walt Disney World project. It is represented that, while it is planned to purchase between 60% and 70% of the project's power requirements from the Florida Power Corp., (a non-affiliated company), the proposed electric energy generating facilities are indispensable to the safe and uninterrupted operation of the project. 1/ (Rel. 35-17236)

**METROPOLITAN EDISON.** The SEC has issued a notice under the Holding Company Act giving interested persons until September 7 to request a hearing upon an application of Metropolitan Edison Co., Berks County, Pa. subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corp, among other things, to increase from \$44 million to \$50 million the amount of short-term notes it may issue to banks and to extend from December 31, 1971 to December 31, 1972, the date up to which it may issue such notes. Net proceeds of its borrowings will be used for construction expenditures, repayment of short-term borrowings and other corporate purposes. 1/ (Release 35-17237)

A notice was also issued under the Holding Company Act giving interested persons until September 10, to request a hearing upon another application of Metropolitan Edison to issue and sell 160,000 shares of cumulative preferred stock (\$100 par) at competitive bidding. Net proceeds will be used to pay a portion of the company's short-term borrowings, which were incurred for construction purposes and are expected to aggregate \$49 million at the time of the proposed sale, and for other corporate purposes. Construction expenditures are estimated at \$107.8 million for 1971. 1/ (Release 35-17238)

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SECURITIES ACT REGISTRATIONS

KENTUCKY UTILITIES COMPANY, 120 South Limestone St., Lexington, Kentucky 40507, filed a registration statement on August 16 seeking registration of \$35 million of first mortgage bonds, Series J, due 2001, to be offered for public sale at competitive bidding. Net proceeds will be used to finance a part of the cost of the company's construction expenditures, including payment of short-term borrowings incurred for interim financing of such expenditures (such borrowings estimated at \$32 million at the time of the issuance of the bonds). Construction expenditures are estimated at \$52 million for 1971 and \$73,950,000 for 1972. (File 2-41467)

CENTRAL ILLINOIS PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY, 607 East Adams St., Springfield, Ill. 62701, filed two registration statements on August 16 seeking registration of (a) \$22,500,000 of first mortgage bonds, Series O, due 2001, to be offered for public sale at competitive bidding (File 2-41468) and (b) 125,000 shares of cumulative preferred stock (\$100 par), to be offered for public sale (\*at \$102 per share maximum) through underwriters headed by Halsey, Stuart & Co., Inc., 123 South LaSalle St., Chicago, Ill. 60603 (File 2-41469). Net proceeds of the company's financing will be used to refund and retire at maturity \$34,353,000 of first mortgage bonds, Series A, 3-3/8%, due October 1971, and for other corporate purposes. (File 2-41468 and 2-41469)

COMPUTER DESIGN CORPORATION, 12401 West Olympic Blvd., Los Angeles, Calif. 90064, filed a registration statement on August 17 seeking registration of 448,315 shares of common stock, of which 300,000 are to be offered for public sale by the company and 148,315 (being outstanding shares) by the holders thereof. The offering is to be made (\*at \$20 per share maximum) through underwriters headed by Blyth & Co., Inc., 629 S. Spring St., and Mitchum, Jones & Templeton, Inc., 510 S. Spring St., both of Los Angeles. The company designs, manufactures and sells programmable and non-programmable electronic calculators. Net proceeds of the company's stock sale will be used for working capital and other corporate purposes. (File 2-41476)

PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY OF NEW MEXICO, 414 Silver Ave., S.W., Albuquerque, New Mexico 87101, filed a registration statement on August 17 seeking registration of \$20 million of first mortgage bonds, due 2001, to be offered for public sale at competitive bidding. Net proceeds of its bond sale, together with proceeds estimated at \$7 million from the sale of common stock, will be used for construction purposes, including repayment of short-term borrowings for such purposes (such borrowings aggregate \$20,710,000). Construction expenditures are estimated at \$112 million for the five-year period 1971 through 1975. (File 2-41477)

FREDERICK & HERRUD, INC., 1487 Farnsworth, Detroit, Mich. 48211, filed a registration statement on August 17 seeking registration of 725,000 shares of common stock, of which 240,000 are to be offered for public sale by the company and 485,000 (being outstanding shares) by the holders thereof. The offering is to be made (\*at \$18 per share maximum) through underwriters headed by Paine, Webber, Jackson & Curtis, 140 Broadway, New York 10005, and Watling, Lerchen & Co., 300 Ford Bldg., Detroit, Mich. 48226. The company is engaged in the slaughtering and processing of hogs and the sale of meat and meat products. Of the net proceeds of its stock sale, some \$3,250,000 will be used in connection with the expansion of plant facilities and the acquisition of production and delivery equipment and the balance for working capital and other corporate purposes. MITCHELL ENERGY & DEVELOPMENT CORP., 3900 One Shell Plaza, Houston, Tex. 77002, filed a registration statement on August 17 seeking registration of \$10 million of convertible subordinated debentures, due 1991, 750,000 shares of common stock, and warrants to purchase 400,000 shares of common stock, to be offered for public sale in units, each consisting of a \$200 debenture, 15 shares and 8 warrants and (\*and at \$500 per unit). The offering is to be made through underwriters headed by F. Eberstadt & Co., Inc., 61 Broadway, and Coggeshall & Hicks Inc., 1 Liberty St., both of New York. The company is engaged in the exploration for and production and transmission of natural gas and oil, and in real estate operations. Of the net proceeds of its financing, \$17 million will be applied to payment of indebtedness and accounts payable and the balance used for working capital and other corporate purposes. POST CORPORATION, 306 W. Washington St., Appleton, Wisconsin 54911, filed a registration statement on August 17 seeking registration of 190,000 shares of common stock, of which 175,000 are to be offered for public sale by the company and 15,000 (being outstanding shares) by the holders thereof. The offering is to be made (\*at \$20 per share maximum) through underwriters headed by duPont, Glore Forgan Inc., and Loewi & Co., Inc. The company is engaged primarily in the publication of newspapers, the operation of television and radio station and the underwriting of property and casualty insurance. Of the net proceeds of its stock sale \$1,500,000 will be invested in the company's property and casualty insurance subsidiary and the balance for working capital and other corporate purposes. EATON CORPORATION, 100 Erieview Plaza, Cleveland, Ohio 44114, filed a registration statement on August 17 seeking registration of \$60 million of debentures, due 1996, to be offered for public sale through underwriters headed by Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith Inc., 70 Pine St., New York 10005. The company sells, among other things, vehicles, vehicle components, industrial power transmission systems and components, appliance controls and Yale locks. Net proceeds of its debenture sale will be used to repay the company's U.S. short term bank debt and commercial paper outstanding, which on June 30 totaled \$55 million; the balance will be used for general corporate purposes.
