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### NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS

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## RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

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### PROPOSED RULE 2a-7 SUBMITTED FOR CLEARANCE

The Commission, pursuant to the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1980, has submitted for clearance proposed Rule 2a-7 under the Investment Company Act of 1940 which would provide exemptions to certain registered open-end investment companies, commonly known as money market funds, to permit such companies either to value portfolio instruments by use of the amortized cost valuation method or to compute current price per share by rounding the net asset value per share to the nearest one cent on a share value of one dollar.

The potential respondents are all money market funds relying on the exemptive rule as a basis for use of either the amortized cost valuation method or the penny-rounding pricing method. The effect of the promulgation of this rule on these respondents is threefold: (1) it would obviate the need to file individual applications for exemptive relief to permit such valuation and pricing methods; (2) it would continue the recordkeeping currently required under the exemptive orders as to procedures adopted by the board of directors and the pricing of the fund shares; and (3) it would modify the reporting requirements to the Commission so that reports will be required only when certain actions are taken rather than quarterly.

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## COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

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### EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE WILL HOLD SECOND MEETING TO PLAN GOVERNMENT-BUSINESS FORUM

The Commission, pursuant to The Small Business Investment Incentive Act of 1980, is required to conduct an annual Government-Business Forum to review the current status of problems and programs relating to small business capital formation. The Executive Committee, comprised of appointees from several federal agencies and private sector organizations, will hold its second meeting on June 28, 1982 at 10:00 a.m., for purposes of planning the Forum. The Forum is scheduled for September 1982. The meeting is to be held at the SEC, Room 776, 500 North Capitol Street, Washington, D.C., and will be open to the public.

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## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

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### COMPLAINT NAMES EDWARD P. JOHNSON, JR. AND RICHARD A. CLAY

The Washington Regional Office announced that on June 22 a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Edward P. Johnson, Jr. of Potomac, Maryland, and Richard A. Clay of New York, New York.

The complaint alleges that Johnson and Clay, while a director and vice president (finance), respectively, for E.C. Ernst, Inc., violated the proxy rules of the securities laws with respect to a Form S-14 filed with the Commission on May 8, 1978 and a proxy statement dated the same day. The complaint alleges that Ernst's income statement of December 31, 1977, included in those materials, did not disclose various uncertainties concerning the collectibility of certain contract changes that, if taken into account, would have made Ernst's reported pre-tax income of \$3,851,188 materially less. The complaint further alleges that Clay caused pre-tax income for Ernst to be overstated in the same filings by \$274,000, by failing to write off Ernst's investment in a joint venture in a timely fashion, and by failing to disclose the bankrupt status of the company in which Ernst had the joint venture interest. The complaint also alleges that the defendants aided and abetted violations of the periodic reporting provisions of the securities laws with respect to unaudited financial statements of Ernst filed with the Commission for the nine month period ended December 31, 1977.

Simultaneous with the filing of the complaint the defendants, without admitting or denying the allegations contained therein, consented to the entry of final judgments permanently enjoining them from future violations of the proxy solicitation rules and from future aiding and abetting of violations of the periodic reporting provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.
