ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

CMC FUNDING, LTD. AND ROBERT A. MCDANIEL SANCTIONED

The Commission has issued an order instituting public administrative proceedings pursuant to Section 9(b) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 and Section 203(3) and (f) of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940, naming as respondents CMC Funding, Ltd. (Funding), and Robert A. McDaniel, both of Dallas, Texas. Funding, a limited partnership, is the investment adviser to The Texas Money Fund, Inc. (TMF), an investment company located in Dallas, which operates as a money market fund. McDaniel is a general partner of Funding and is the president and chairman of the Board of TMF.

Simultaneously with the institution of the proceedings, the Commission accepted a joint offer of settlement in which the respondents, without admitting or denying the allegations, consented to the entry of findings and an order by the Commission censuring them. The respondents also agreed to abide by their undertakings which are designed to prevent a recurrence of the violations.

The sanctions were based on findings that Funding and McDaniel wilfully aided and abetted violations, by TMF, of: (1) the conditions of an Order issued by the Commission on March 19, 1981, permitting TMF to value the securities in its portfolio pursuant to the amortized cost method of valuation; and (2) certain record-keeping provisions of the Investment Company Act. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES RONALD S. LEE AND MATTIE L. LEE

The Washington Regional Office announced that on September 14 a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia, Richmond Division, naming as defendants Ronald S. Lee and Mattie L. Lee, individually and doing business as Lee Investment Services.

The complaint alleges that from about January 1979 to the present, the defendants violated the securities and investment adviser registration provisions and the antifraud and prohibited practices provisions of the securities laws by inducing at least 28 investors from Virginia, the District of Columbia and three other states to turn over approximately \$287,000 for the defendants to invest and manage. The complaint alleges that the defendants issued unregistered stock in United Capital Investors, Inc. and certain notes which, among other things, purported to represent fractional interests in large denomination certificates of deposit. The complaint further alleges that defendants converted investor funds to their personal use.

The complaint seeks Orders of Preliminary Injunction and Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction enjoining defendants from further violations of Section 5(a), 5(c) and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 (the securities registration and antifraud provisions) and Sections 203 and 206 of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 and Rule 206(4)-2 (the investment adviser registration and prohibited practices provisions).

The complaint also seeks relief in the form of a freeze and accounting of defendants assets, an accounting of investor funds and disgorgement by defendants of funds illegally obtained from investors. (SEC v. Ronald S. Lee, et al., U.S.D.C., E.D. Va., Civil Action No. 82-0589R). (LR-9755)

Orders, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, have been issued on an application by United Cash Management, Inc., and United Investors Money Market Fund, Inc. (Applicants), open-end, diversified, management investment companies, exempting Applicants from the provisions of Section 2(a)(41) of the Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 thereunder, to the extent necessary to permit Applicants to compute their net asset value per share using the amortized cost method of valuing portfolio securities. (Rel. IC-12653; IC-12654 - Sept. 13)

PENN MUTUAL VARIABLE ANNUITY ACCOUNT III

A notice has been issued on an application filed by the Penn Mutual Life Insurance Company, Penn Mutual Variable Annuity Account III, and Penn Mutual Equity Services, Inc., for an order, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, granting exemptions to the extent necessary from the provisions of Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 22(c), 26(a), 27(c)(1), 27(c)(2) and 27(d) of the Act and Rule 22c-1 thereunder and, pursuant to Section 11 of the Act, approving the terms of certain offers of exchange. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE ROCKY RIVER REALTY COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 6 to request a hearing on a proposal of The Rocky River Realty Company, The Connecticut Light and Power Company, and Western Massachusetts Electric Company, subsidiaries of Northeast Utilities, regarding the issuance and sale by Rocky River of \$8 million of long-term unsecured notes by a negotiated offering and guarantees thereof by the other two companies. MICHIGAN POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 6 to request a hearing on a proposal by Michigan Power Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to issue and sell through December 31, 1983, up to \$20 million of long-term notes to one or more commercial banks. Michigan Power intends to refinance a like amount of long-term unsecured notes bearing a fluctuating interest rate. (Rel. 35-22630 - Sept. 10)

ARKANSAS POWER AND LIGHT COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 4 to request a hearing on a proposal by Arkansas Power and Light Company, Louisiana Power and Light Company, Mississippi Power and Light Company and New Orleans Public Service Inc., subsidiaries of Middle South Utilities, Inc., whereby System Fuels, Inc. (SFI), would enter into amendments to a previously authorized loan agreement, and related financing arrangements, pursuant to which an unaffiliated company makes loans to SFI of up to \$100 million outstanding at any one time. The amendments extend the term of the loan agreement to July 31, 1985, increase the commitment fee paid to a bank under a related credit agreement, and grant an additional security interest for the performance of SFI's obligations. AVATAR UTILITIES INC. OF FLORIDA

WHEELING ELECTRIC COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing the Wheeling Electric Company, subsidiary of The American Electric Power Company, to issue up to \$22 million of unsecured notes at a fixed rate of interest, no greater than the prime rate until October 31, 1983 and no greater than 104 percent of prime thereafter, for terms of not less than two nor more than ten years. This authority is effective until December 31, 1983 and has been granted in order to permit Wheeling to refinance a like amount of unsecured notes bearing a fluctuating interest rate.
