## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

### KEITH E. WENTZ, OTHERS CITED

Public administrative proceedings have been instituted against Wulff Hansen & Co., a San Francisco broker-dealer, and Keith E. Wentz and Ronald P. Bynum, two registered representatives formerly associated with that firm. The Order for Proceedings alleges, among other things, insider trading violations during March 1980 by each respondent in the stock of Gulf Energy Corporation and the preparation and dissemination in 1980 by Wentz and the firm of a false and misleading research report about Gulf. Concurrently with the institution of the proceedings, the Commission issued an order accepting an Offer of Settlement from Wulff Hansen & Co., pursuant to which findings were made and sanctions were imposed. The firm neither admitted nor denied the violations alleged. A hearing will be scheduled on the allegations against Wentz and Bynum. (Rel. 34-19080 and 34-19081)

### DEAN W. CLUFF CITED

Public administrative proceedings have been instituted against Dean W. Cluff, a registered broker-dealer formerly of San Francisco, California. The Order for Proceedings alleges that, between July 1977 and August 1980, Cluff wilfully violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of securities in the form of investment contracts relating to an options investment program. A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations are true, and if so, what, if any, sanctions should be ordered by the Commission. (Rel. 34-19086)

## CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

### JAMES R. OVERCASH INDICTED

The U.S. Attorney for the Middle District of Alabama and the Atlanta Regional Office announced that on September 29 a Federal Grand Jury in Montgomery, Alabama, returned a 14-count indictment against James R. Overcash of Lanett, Alabama, also known as Charles L. Brooks, individually and doing business as J & R Mail Service, charging the defendant with six counts of securities fraud, five counts of mail fraud and three counts of selling unregistered securities in the form of investment contracts in connection with Overcash's operation of a Ponzi scheme.

The indictment alleges, among other things, that Overcash induced investors to forward money to him on the promise of receiving up to a 25 percent return on the funds invested for periods of 20 to 30 days and that he told investors that six wealthy businessmen were associated with him in his investment plan; that the money invested with the defendant was forwarded to these businessmen to invest in high yield investments in industries such as oil and movies, which high return enabled the defendant in turn to pay a high return. None of these statements were true.

The indictment charges that Overcash used funds invested for his personal benefit and deposited the remainder in a non-interest bearing checking account, repaying earlier investors with the funds received from later investors.

In addition to the above charges, the indictment alleges that Overcash continued operation of this scheme under the alias of "Charles L. Brooks" after having been permanently enjoined by the Honorable Myron H. Thompson, U.S. Judge for the Middle District of Alabama, on October 23, 1981, as a result of a prior civil action brought by the Commission. In addition to the permanent injunction, the District Court previously appointed a receiver to liquidate assets in the name of J & R Mail Service, and imposed a constructive trust over Overcash's assets. 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## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### E. F. HUTTON AND COMPANY INC.

An order, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, has been issued on an application by E.F. Hutton and Company Inc. and Directions Unit Investment Trust, First Series and Subsequent Series (Applicants), exempting Applicants to the extent necessary (1) from the requirements of Section 14(a) of the Act, and (2) from the provisions of Section 22(c) of the Act and Rule 22c-1 thereunder to permit Applicants, in selling units of each series of Directions Unit Investment Trust (Trust) to the public, to fill purchase orders received on the first day of the initial public offering period at a price based on the value of the Trust's assets determined as of the close of business on the business day prior to such date. ### THE OHIO NATIONAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

A notice has been issued on an application filed by The Ohio National Life Insurance Company (Ohio National), Ohio National Variable Account A, Ohio National Variable Account B and the O.N. Equity Sales Company for an order, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, granting exemptions from Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 22(c), 26(a), 26(a)(2)(C), 26(a)(2)(D), 27(c)(1), 27(c)(2) and 27(d) of the Act and Rule 22c-1 thereunder and, pursuant to Section 11 of the Act, approving the terms of certain offers of exchange. ### COLONIAL FUND SINGLE PAYMENT PLANS

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 29 to request a hearing on an application filed by Colonial Fund Single Payment Plans (Applicant), registered under the Investment Company Act of 1940 as a unit investment trust, for an order, pursuant to Section 8(f) of the Act, declaring that Applicant has ceased to be an investment company as defined in the Act. 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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### THE CONNECTICUT LIGHT & POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 1 to request a hearing on a proposal by The Connecticut Light & Power Company (CL&P), subsidiary of Northeast Utilities, to execute several transactions, including: (1) a multi-bank \$75 million Eurodollar credit arrangement; (2) the organization of a new foreign subsidiary capitalized by a portion of the funds borrowed under the credit arrangement; (3) the issue and sell of debentures by the new subsidiary in the Eurobond market, the total net proceeds of which will be loaned to CL&P. CL&P has also requested exceptions from the competitive bidding requirements of Rule 50. (Rel. 35-22655 - Oct. 4)

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## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

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### NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. has filed a proposed rule change pursuant to Rule 19b-4 (SR-NASD-82-11) to adopt a comprehensive Code of Procedure designed to codify informal procedures and consolidate provisions from the Code of Procedure for Handling Trade Practice Complaints, the Rules of Fair Practice and the By-Laws of the Association. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of October 4. (Rel. 34-19097)

### NOTICE OF EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A proposed rule change filed by Depository Trust Company, pursuant to Rule 19b-4, (SR-DTC-82-6) has become effective in accordance with Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposed rule change allows DTC to add a 12 percent surcharge to its participants' monthly invoices, from August 1, 1982 through the end of the year, subject to possible reduction. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of October 4. (Rel. 34-19098)

### NOTICE AND ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE
