# Part 4 Boundaries

## Standards for USGS and USDA Forest Service Single Edition Quadrangle Maps

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#### 4. BOUNDARIES

This part of the standard provides a description of the Boundaries features shown on USGS and USDA Forest Service single edition quadrangle maps.

**BOUNDARY LINE** 

**BOUNDARY LINE** - The limiting line of jurisdictional authority for various levels of government.

#### Characteristics

Show the following BOUNDARY LINES based on the acceptability status of the boundary line:

Approved The description of the line has been approved and

accepted by the delegated authority for such

action.

Disputed The description of the line has not been approved

or accepted by the delegated authority because of

conflicting or unclear legal definitions.

Historical Feature is historically significant.

Show the following BOUNDARY LINES based on their positional accuracy:

Definite Conditions permit the feature to be confidently

positioned. Horizontal data are confidently positioned within 0.02" (40 feet at 1:24,000 scale), at map scale, of true ground position. Vertical data are confidently positioned within one-half contour interval of the true ground

position.

Indefinite Conditions prevent the feature from being

confidently positioned. Horizontal data cannot be confidently positioned within 0.02" (40 feet at 1:24,000 scale), at map scale, of the true ground position. Vertical data cannot be confidently positioned within one-half contour

interval of the true ground position.

Unspecified Does not have to be known or specified for the

feature to be shown.

Show the names of BOUNDARY LINES if they are known.

BOUNDARY LINE

#### Delineation

The limit of a BOUNDARY LINE is the position as defined by law or proclamation.

#### <u>Depiction Conditions</u>

If a BOUNDARY LINE is associated with a CITY, COUNTY, MINOR CIVIL DIVISION, NATION, RESERVATION, or STATE/TERRITORY,

Or

If a BOUNDARY LINE is the Von Schmidt boundary line of California/Nevada, Then show.

#### Source Interpretation Guidelines

All

If a BOUNDARY LINE of a COUNTY, NATION, or STATE/TERRITORY is approved but indefinite, show the positional accuracy of the line by label and by reducing the lineweight of the line.

If a BOUNDARY LINE of a CITY, COUNTY, MINOR CIVIL DIVISION, NATION, or STATE/TERRITORY is approved and the positional accuracy is not known or specified, show the positional accuracy of the line as unspecified.

A BOUNDARY LINE of a RESERVATION must be approved to show. Depict the positional accuracy of the line as unspecified.

If a BOUNDARY LINE of a COUNTY, NATION, or STATE/TERRITORY is disputed and is monumented, show the disputed line status by label and indicate the positional accuracy of the line as definite.

If a BOUNDARY LINE of a COUNTY, NATION, or STATE/TERRITORY is disputed, is not monumented, and has a position that is accepted as a neutral one, show the disputed line status by label and indicate the positional accuracy of the line as indefinite by reducing the lineweight of the line.

Do not show BOUNDARY LINES of COUNTIES, NATIONS, or STATE/TERRITORIES that are disputed, not monumented, and do not have positions that are accepted as neutral.

If a BOUNDARY LINE of a CITY or MINOR CIVIL DIVISION is approved but indefinite, show the positional accuracy of the line by label only.

**BOUNDARY LINE** 

If a BOUNDARY LINE of a CITY or MINOR CIVIL DIVISION is disputed and has a positional accuracy of definite, indefinite, or unspecified, show the disputed line status by label but do not indicate the positional accuracy of the line.

The Von Schmidt Line is the only BOUNDARY LINE considered to be historical.

Show the seaward limit of a COUNTY, NATION, or STATE/TERRITORY if usable descriptions are available to position the line.

Show Federal area boundary enhancement on the BOUNDARY LINES of all Federally administered RESERVATIONS. Do not show Federal boundary enhancement on BOUNDARY LINES of Indian lands or Forest Service Administrative Areas and Forest Service Ranger Districts within National Forests. For more information on Indian lands, Forest Service Administrative Areas and Forest Service Ranger Districts, see RESERVATION.

Do not depict the limiting lines of privately owned land within National Forest, National Grassland, National Trail, National Wild and Scenic Rivers, and National Wilderness proclamation boundaries and USDA Forest Service land outside of National Forest proclamation boundaries as BOUNDARY LINES. See LAND PARCEL.

Do not depict the limits of former lighthouse reservations, Indian reservations, or military reservations as BOUNDARY LINES. See SURVEY LINE (Public Land Survey System theme).

Current jurisdictional boundary lines may have associated names. For example, show the State boundary line between Maryland and Pennsylvania with the name "MASON-DIXON LINE".

All county parks are RESERVATIONS, even though small county parks are symbolized with the same boundary line as PARKS (Built-up theme).

If two or more BOUNDARY LINES are coincident, show the highest order line and label the lower order lines, when necessary for clarity. The hierarchy of boundaries (from most important to least important) is: NATION, STATE/TERRITORY, COUNTY, MINOR CIVIL DIVISION, CITY, AND RESERVATION.

BOUNDARY LINE

#### Graphic

On USGS maps published before 1994, only COUNTY or STATE/TERRITORY boundaries were shown as disputed. If the land portion of a county or State boundary is symbolized on the previously published map with an indefinite boundary line symbol and a note in the margin indicates the line is in dispute, show the disputed line status by label and the positional accuracy of the line as indefinite by lineweight.

If a county or State boundary is symbolized on the previously published map with an indefinite boundary line symbol but there is no indication that the line is in dispute, show the positional accuracy of the line as indefinite by lineweight and label but do not label the line as disputed.

Do not show reservations with disputed boundary lines on previously published maps.

Show sections of the international boundary between the U.S. and Mexico that are symbolized on previously published maps with civil township boundary symbols and labeled "JURISDICTIONAL BOUNDARY" or "INTERNATIONAL JURISDICTIONAL LINE" as approved BOUNDARY LINES with a definite positional accuracy.

The seaward portions of the international boundary between the U.S. and Canada are in dispute. They have sometimes been dropped and sometimes indicated with labels, such as "Approximate" or "Proposed". If the line has been shown on the previously published map, show the disputed line status by label and the positional accuracy of the line as indefinite by lineweight. If the line has not been shown on the previously published map, do not show a BOUNDARY LINE.

All city and private parks are PARKS (Built-up theme), even though they may be symbolized by a reservation boundary line on previously published maps.

BOUNDARY POINT

**BOUNDARY POINT** - An identified location on or near a current boundary or former boundary.

#### Characteristics

Show the following BOUNDARY POINTS:

General Case Those that are in common use.

Reference Point that defines an adjacent boundary.

Show the officially accepted identifiers of BOUNDARY POINTS if they are known.

#### <u>Delineation</u>

The limit of a BOUNDARY POINT is the location marked by or referenced from a structure that marks the location of a point determined by surveying.

#### <u>Depiction Conditions</u>

If a BOUNDARY POINT is monumented, is located on, or is a reference point for BOUNDARY LINE, and is officially accepted,

Or

If a BOUNDARY POINT is unmonumented, is located on a BOUNDARY LINE, and is defined by an officially accepted reference monument, Then show.

#### Source Interpretation Guidelines

All

If a BOUNDARY POINT meets the depiction conditions and has third order or better vertical or horizontal control established on it, show the BOUNDARY POINT and the vertical or horizontal control value.

If a BOUNDARY POINT meets the depiction conditions and has an established SPOT ELEVATION (Hypsography theme) on it, show the BOUNDARY POINT and the SPOT ELEVATION.

Points that relate only to the Public Land Survey System or a Land Grant are not depicted as BOUNDARY POINTS. See SURVEY CORNER (Public Land Survey System theme).

If a survey location defines the limits of more than one survey (PLSS-related survey versus an administrative boundary), show one feature, either a SURVEY

#### BOUNDARY POINT

CORNER (Public Land Survey System theme) or a BOUNDARY POINT, based on the intended purpose of establishing the original monument.

A BOUNDARY POINT on a disputed BOUNDARY LINE is "officially accepted", if recognized by at least one of the contesting official entities.

#### Graphic

Show as symbolized on the previously published map. If the feature is symbolized in black, show a BOUNDARY POINT. If the feature is symbolized in red, show a SURVEY CORNER (Public Land Survey System theme).

CITY

CITY - An incorporated, populated place such as a village, city, town, or borough, including an independent city.

#### Characteristics

Show the names and BOUNDARY LINES of CITIES.

#### Delineation

The limit of a CITY is the extent of the jurisdictional authority.

#### <u>Depiction Conditions</u>

Show all.

#### Source Interpretation Guidelines

#### All

Do not depict unincorporated places as CITIES. See POPULATED PLACE (Built-up theme).

See appendix 4-A to determine which combinations of CITY and MINOR CIVIL DIVISION occur in the various States, outlying areas, freely associated States, and trust territories.

COUNTY

**COUNTY** - Second order division of a nation such as parish, borough, municipio, judicial division, and independent cities in Maryland, Missouri, Nevada, and Virginia.

#### <u>Characteristics</u>

Show the names and BOUNDARY LINES of COUNTIES.

#### <u>Delineation</u>

The limit of a COUNTY is the extent of the jurisdictional authority.

#### <u>Depiction Conditions</u>

Show all.

#### Source Interpretation Guidelines

#### All

See appendix 4-A to determine which areas are depicted as COUNTIES within the various States, outlying areas, freely associated States, and trust territories.

LAND PARCEL

LAND PARCEL - A tract or plot of the Earth's surface distinguished by ownership.

#### <u>Characteristics</u>

N/A

#### **Delineation**

The limit of a LAND PARCEL is the extent of the ownership.

#### <u>Depiction Conditions</u>

If a LAND PARCEL is within the proclamation boundary of a National Forest, National Grassland, National Trail, National Wild and Scenic River, or National Wilderness, is privately owned, and is  $\geq 0.05$ " (100 feet at 1:24,000 scale) along the shortest axis,

Or

If a LAND PARCEL is outside the proclamation boundary of a National Forest, has been purchased by the USDA Forest Service, and is  $\ge 0.05$ " (100 feet at 1:24,000 scale) along the shortest axis,

Or

If a LAND PARCEL is privately owned, is  $\geq 0.05$ " (100 feet at 1:24,000 scale) along the shortest axis, and is within a LAND PARCEL purchased by the USDA Forest Service that is outside the proclamation boundary of a National Forest, Then show.

#### Source Interpretation Guidelines

All

Show the non-National Forest System Lands area tint in privately owned LAND PARCELS within National Forest, National Grassland, National Trail, National Wild and Scenic River, and National Wilderness proclamation boundaries. Also show the tint in privately owned LAND PARCELS that are within LAND PARCELS purchased by the USDA Forest Service that are outside National Forest proclamation boundaries.

Show the Federal area boundary enhancement on the limiting lines of LAND PARCELS purchased by the USDA Forest Service outside National Forest proclamation boundaries. Also show the name of the administering National Forest within the bounded area.

Forest Service Administrative Area and Forest Service Ranger District boundaries within National Forests are not depicted as LAND PARCELS. See

LAND PARCEL

BOUNDARY LINE. For more information on Forest Service Administrative Areas and Forest Service Ranger Districts, see RESERVATION.

MINOR CIVIL DIVISION

MINOR CIVIL DIVISION - Third order division of a nation such as township, town, district, precinct, or barrio.

#### Characteristics

Show the names and BOUNDARY LINES of MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

#### <u>Delineation</u>

The limit of a MINOR CIVIL DIVISION is the extent of the jurisdictional authority.

#### <u>Depiction Conditions</u>

If a MINOR CIVIL DIVISION is not in the State of Nebraska and has an active government, or is in the State of West Virginia, Then show.

#### Source Interpretation Guidelines

All

West Virginia Senate Bill 184, passed April 10, 1973, established that the magisterial districts shown on USGS maps as of July 1, 1978, were to be the official county subdivisions. This bill also changed the term "magisterial district" to "tax district". Many of the original magisterial districts have been subsequently redistricted and renamed for voting purposes only. Unfortunately, the county subdivision names and boundary lines shown in the 1980 and 1990 Census Bureau books are voting districts. Some of the county subdivision names and/or boundary lines may have been incorrectly changed to reflect the Census Bureau information during map revision. These names and boundaries must be changed back to the official county subdivisions shown on USGS maps as of July 1, 1978.

If a NATION is Canada or Mexico, Then show.

RESERVATION

**RESERVATION** - Bounded land set aside for a particular purpose, generally having certain use restrictions.

#### Characteristics

Show the following RESERVATIONS:

Forest Area primarily for the management of forest

resources.

Grassland Area primarily for the management of native

grasses.

Indian Land As defined by Bureau of Indian Affairs.

Military Area for carrying out military activities.

Park Areas for public recreation and preservation of a

cultural or natural resource.

Prison Areas for housing persons convicted and sentenced

for crimes.

Unspecified Does not have to be known or specified for the

feature to be shown.

Wilderness Area virtually unsettled and uncultivated

(natural); includes areas designated by an administrative group as wilderness, primitive,

wild and scenic, or similar designation.

Wildlife Area primarily for wildlife management or

preservation; includes the following areas:
conservation, game, hunting/fishing, preserve, or

other "wildlife" designation.

Show the following RESERVATIONS based on their administrative status:

County

Federal

RESERVATION

Native Corporation

Regional Group of State, county, and/or city governments.

State

Tribe/BIA

Show the following areas within National Forest RESERVATIONS:

Forest Service

Administrative Area Area that is administered by an adjacent National

Forest because it is difficult to access.

Forest Service

Ranger District Area that is administered by a Ranger Office.

Show the names, administrative status, and BOUNDARY LINES of RESERVATIONS.

#### Delineation

The limit of a RESERVATION is the extent of the jurisdictional authority.

#### <u>Depiction Conditions</u>

Show all.

#### Source Interpretation Guidelines

See appendix 4-B for examples of RESERVATIONS.

If a RESERVATION totally or partially coincides with another feature, such as an AQUACULTURE SITE, CAMPGROUND, OUTDOOR THEATER, or SPORTS SITE, show the RESERVATION and the other feature.

Do not depict former Indian reservations as RESERVATIONS. See SURVEY LINE (Public Land Survey System theme).

Do not depict city and private parks as RESERVATIONS. See PARK (Built-Up theme).

All county parks are RESERVATIONS, even though small county parks are

RESERVATION

symbolized with the same boundary line as PARKS (Built-up theme).

Do not show Research Natural Areas of the USDA Forest Service.

If Indian land coincides with another RESERVATION, show the representation and symbolization on a case-by-case basis.

For information on privately owned areas within National Forests, National Grasslands, National Trails, National Wild and Scenic Rivers, National Wildernesses, and USDA Forest Service land outside of National Forest proclamation areas, see LAND PARCEL.

For information on boundary lines, see BOUNDARY LINE.

Do not depict areas that lack approved reservation boundaries as RESERVATIONS. See INSTITUTIONAL SITES (Built-up theme).

#### Graphic

All city and private parks are PARKS (Built-up theme), even though they may be symbolized by a reservation boundary line on previously published maps.

Show all.
