**FOUR CHARGED WITH DISTRIBUTION OF METHAMPHETAMINE**

BALTIMORE, Maryland - United States Attorney for the District of Maryland Rod J. Rosenstein announces that today a criminal complaint was filed charging Terry Lee McMillion, age 44 and Carol Ann Lee, age 42, both of Collinsville, Pennsylvania and Donald Lee Burchett, Sr., age 44 and Mary Atti, age 48, both of Street, Maryland for conspiracy to distribute and possess with intent to distribute methamphetamine.

The affidavit filed with the criminal complaint alleges that McMillion was manufacturing methamphetamine in laboratories in Maryland and Pennsylvania. Donald Burchett, Sr. and Mary Atti manufactured the methamphetamine at their homes in Harford County, Maryland. Carol Ann Lee, McMillion's girlfriend, was responsible for transporting the finished methamphetamine product from the Harford County labs of Burchett, Sr. and Atti, and additional laboratories in southern Pennsylvania, to McMillion for distribution. The defendants were arrested yesterday.

Each defendant faces a maximum sentence of 40 years in prison and a minimum mandatory sentence of 5 years in prison, followed by 5 years of supervised release. The defendants had their initial appearances today and were detained pending detention hearings, scheduled for Tuesday, July

19, 2005 at 2:30 pm.

A criminal complaint is not a finding of guilt. An individual charged by criminal complaint is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty at some later criminal proceedings.

The criminal charges in this case are the result of a joint investigation by the Drug Enforcement Administration, Baltimore and Harrisburg Field Offices, Harford County Sheriff's Office, Pennsylvania State Police, and the United States Attorney's Office. The case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Christopher J. Romano.
