SUBJECT: The Nine Principles of Development

As we start a new year I want to share with you my thoughts on USAID's guiding principles.

Over the last several months, there has been an effort to formalize and annunciate how we do our work. Thanks to the thoughtful input and energetic discussion in Washington and in many field missions, we have been able to distill the fundamental lessons learned throughout USAID's experience into a series of principles that describe the way we approach, understand and assess our endeavors. History has shown us that where these principles have been consistently applied, the success of our programs was enhanced; where they have been ignored, our programs have faced great challenges.

USAID's Nine Principles of Development and Reconstruction will help us strengthen and formalize USAID's institutional culture at a time of significant retirements and new recruitment. They will also help us articulate to those outside the development community how we approach development, which is especially important given the new prominence of development in national security policy.
