CONTRACT INFORMATION BULLETIN 99 - 12

The purpose of this Contract Information Bulletin (CIB) is to inform you that Sudan is not an eligible source for procurement.

Pursuant to Executive Order 13067, dated November 3, 1997, the President has deemed the Government of Sudan as a threat to national security and foreign policy of the United States. As such, the Department of Treasury added sanction regulation (31 U.S.C. 538) covering Sudan that prohibited transactions of goods and services from Sudan and exportation of goods, technology, or services to Sudan. Further, FAC 97-05 revised FAR 25.701 "Restrictions" and the clause 52.225-11 "Restrictions on Certain Foreign Purchases" to list Sudan as a prohibited source.

Based on the above, Sudan is an ineligible source for any USAID-financed transactions in accordance with the policy on Foreign Assets Control in ADS 313.5.1. M/OP/P will request the Assistant Administrator of the Bureau for Policy and Program Coordination AA/PPC to include Sudan to the list of foreign policy restricted countries under the USAID Geographical Code Book.
