SUBJECT: Revised FY 2001 DWSRF Grant Awards

This memo transmits revisions to the FY2001 grant allotments for the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) program. Changes were required to accommodate a government-wide rescission of 0.22 percent included within the Omnibus Budget bill passed in the end of 2000.

Unlike the rescission on FY2000 funds, which allowed the Agency to make decisions on what programs would be affected, the bill and guidance from the Office of Management and Budget required that the 0.22 percent reduction on FY2001 funds be applied equally to each program, project and activity subject to the rescission. The cut to the DWSRF program was \$1,815,000. We applied the rescission to the original \$825,000,000 to get a new appropriation of \$823,185,000. We removed 1.5 percent for the tribal set-aside and also subjected the other national set-asides (monitoring for unregulated contaminants and operator certification reimbursement grants) to a 0.22 percent cut. The remaining amount was run through our allotment formula.

The attached table shows the revised allotments for the states. The only deviation from the allotment, made for the purposes of rounding, was to subtract \$75 from the national tribal set-aside which was subsequently added to the California allotment. These numbers were loaded into the Integrated Financial Management System on January 29, 2001 and are now available for full award. Please note that the rescission has no effect on the requirement that states obligate payments within 8 quarters of grant award or 12 quarters of allotment.
