The FY 2002 DWSRF funding was made available in the Agency's Integrated Financial Management System (IFMS) as of November 27, 2001. Attached is the final FY 2002 DWSRF State allotment chart (srf02.pdf).

As you know, DWSRF regulations state that "all payments to a State will be made by the earlier of 8 quarters after the capitalization grant is awarded or 12 quarters after funds are allotted to a State." (40CFR35, §3560(b), "Timing of Payments"). This means that payments from the FY 2002 allotment must be made no later than the earlier of 8 quarters after a capitalization grant is awarded or the fourth quarter of FY 2004.
