In the News

President Signs Mental Health and Addiction Parity Bill. On Friday, October 3, 2008, President Bush signed the Paul Wellstone and Pete Domenici Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act of 2008 into law. Earlier in the week, both the US House and the US Senate approved this legislation as part of a larger financial rescue package. In summary, this "parity" bill would require group health plans that currently offer coverage for drug and alcohol addiction and mental illness to provide the same level of coverage as is offered for medical and surgical benefits. California Governor Repeals UPPL Law. Introduced by CA Assembly Member Paul Krekorian in February of 2007, AB 1461 prohibits insurers from including alcohol and drug exclusions in health insurance policies. Governor Schwarzenneger vetoed this bill twice before finally signing it on Tuesday, September 30, 2008.

On August 5, 2008, Massachusetts Governor Deval Patrick signed the mental health parity bill, no. 4423, into law. This bill requires Massachusetts health insurers to cover mental health and substance use disorders in the same way they treat other medical conditions.
