Advocacy: the voice of small business in government

Arizona

Arizona's 461,459 small businesses provide economic opportunities to diverse groups of people and bring innovative products and services to the marketplace.* This profile from the Office of Advocacy compiles the latest facts and figures on the status and role of small business in the state. (Note that a small business is defined here as one with fewer than 500 employees.)

• Arizona had 103,314 small employers in 2005, representing 97.4% of the state's employers and 48.6% of its private-sector employment.

• The construction industry was the state's largest small business employer in 2005; retail trade was the largest overall employer (Table 1).

• Small businesses created 60.4% of the state's net new jobs from 2004 to 2005 (Table 2).

• Arizona's real gross state product increased by 1.8% in 2007. By comparison, growth in the Southwest region was 3.7% and the United States, 2.0%. (Source: U.S. Dept. of Commerce: Bureau of Economic Analysis)
