Advocacy: the voice of small business in government

Louisiana

Louisiana's 350,487 small businesses provide economic opportunities to diverse groups of people and bring innovative products and services to the marketplace.* This profile from the Office of Advocacy compiles the latest facts and figures on the status and role of small business in the state. (Note that a small business is defined here as one with fewer than 500 employees.)

• Louisiana had 80,673 small employers in 2005, representing 97.6% of the state's employers and 54.5% of its private-sector employment.

• The health care and social assistance industry was the state's largest small business and overall employer in 2005 (Table 1).

• Small businesses' and large businesses' net new jobs declined between 2004 and 2005 (Table 2).

• Louisiana's real gross state product increased by 2.6% in 2007. By comparison, growth in the Southeast region was 1.5% and the United States, 2.0%. (Source: U.S. Dept. of Commerce: Bureau of Economic Analysis)
