

## Small Business Profile

Advocacy: the voice of small business in government

## Maine

Maine's 149,062 small businesses provide economic opportunities to diverse groups of people and bring innovative products and services to the marketplace.\* This profile from the Office of Advocacy compiles the latest facts and figures on the status and role of small business in the state. (Note that a small business is defined here as one with fewer than 500 employees.)

- Maine had 35,042 small employers in 2005, representing 97.5% of the state's employers and 60.9% of its private-sector employment.
- The health care and social assistance industry was the state's largest small business and overall employer in 2005 (Table 1).
- Small businesses created 92.6% of the state's net new jobs from 2004 to 2005 (Table 2).
- Maine's real gross state product increased by 1.3% in 2007. By comparison, growth in the New England region was 2.1% and the United States, 2.0%. (Source: U.S. Dept. of Commerce: Bureau of Economic Analysis)
