

## Small Business Profile

Advocacy: the voice of small business in government

## New Mexico

New Mexico's 154,182 small businesses provide economic opportunities to diverse groups of people and bring innovative products and services to the marketplace.\* This profile from the Office of Advocacy compiles the latest facts and figures on the status and role of small business in the state. (Note that a small business is defined here as one with fewer than 500 employees.)

- New Mexico had 36,430 small employers in 2006, representing 96.2% of the state's employers and 57.0% of its private-sector employment.
- The accommodation and food services industry was the state's largest small business employer in 2006; retail trade was the largest overall employer (Table 1).
- Small businesses created 54.3% of the state's net new jobs from 2004 to 2005 (Table 2).
- New Mexico's real gross state product increased by 2.8% in 2007. By comparison, growth in the Southwest region was 3.7% and the United States, 2.0%. (Source: U.S. Dept. of Commerce: Bureau of Economic Analysis)
