Project Outline

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) recently announced the \$650,000 in potential procurement of consulting services under the ADB Technical Assistance (TA) grant programs.

Technical Description

The main objective of this study is to design an effective regulatory system for the gas sector in Afghanistan to ensure efficient development and utilization of natural gas as the domestic market expands. The scope of work under the TA will include reviewing the natural gas sector in the context of issues related to regulatory framework, evaluating the economic impact of regulation, establishing regulatory objectives, identifying appropriate institutional arrangements, and providing analytical and operational support in the functioning of the gas regulatory authority.

Project Site

The project is based in Kabul. The Ministry of Mines and Industries will be the government counterpart for the study.

Project Status/Timeline

ADB will undertake a fact-finding mission in January 2003. Recruitment of consultants is expected to take place in July 2003.

Equipment and Services

An international consulting firm with experience in the development of regulatory structures, gas regulatory issues and systems, evaluation of benefits and costs associated with regulatory reforms, and capacity building related to regulation of gas industry will be required for 12 person-months.

U.S. Competitiveness

U.S. firms should be extremely competitive for consulting services with the ADB. The U.S. is one of the largest contributors to the ADB and there are numerous U.S. firms implementing ADB TA contracts. Firms with regional experience or prior Afghan experience will be very attractive under this opportunity.

Project Financing

ADB will finance this technical assistance grant of \$650,000 under its project number AFG 36286-01.

Conclusion

The Asian Development Bank selects a consultant for a Technical Assistance grant based on its prior Expression of Interest (EOI). An EOI can be transmitted on-line through the ADB's Web site (www.adb.org); it will be acknowledged automatically. Firms may opt to send a hardcopy follow-up EOI addressed to Mr. S. To be considered for employment, consultants must register on the ADB's DACON (data on consulting firms) and DICON (data on individual consultants) systems, otherwise, their EOIs will not be accepted. DACON and DICON registration can now be done on-line at www.adb.org/consulting.
