Background

- TWG raised concerns that C&A on Networx could be costly and jeopardize timeliness of transition
- Major concerns
 - C&A of provider's backbone (the public network)
 - C&A of operational support systems (OSS) of providers
 - Getting decision in time for Agencies to plan
- Formed SWG to define issues and recommend solution for OMB's concurrence



Issues and Status

- Issue 1: Impact of transition on existing C&As
 - SWG Conclusion: Agencies will determine the impact of transition on existing C&As
 - Issue Closed
- Issue 2: Agency interim authority to operate (IATO) when transitioning services provided using public telecommunications network
 - SWG Conclusion: OMB does not recognize IATO's
 - Issue Closed



Issues and Status

- Issue 3: Ability of Government to C&A the public network
 - SWG Conclusion: OMB does not expect Government Agencies to C&A the public Network
 - Issue Closed
- Issue 4: Responsibilities of Agencies that provide contracting vehicles for telecommunications services, such as GSA
 - SWG Conclusion: GSA to identify the appropriate reviews, reports, and other information documenting contract compliance that Agencies need to assist them in certifying their networks
 - In progress (next slide)



Compliance Solution

- GSA develop a "crosswalk" of the security requirements on FTS2001 to Networx
 - Status: Completed. All FTS2001 requirements are in Networx
 - Networx requirements are much more robust
- GSA list security requirements for network service providers on government contracts
 - Status: Completed 5/22



Compliance Solution

- GSA list actions of administrators of network services contracts to monitor contractors' adherence to security requirements
 - Status: SWG comments received 9/1
 - Present to IMC for review and concurrence (see next slide)
- GSA and OMB develop security planning information and disseminate to Agencies in advance of Networx transition.
 - Status: Deleted 8/1 by SWG
 - Agencies accept responsibility to C&A their use of Networx services



GSA Compliance Monitoring

- FAS PMO ensures compliance with contractual requirements
 - Pre-award assessment of plans and test approach
 - Post-award verification of access controls on ordering and billing systems
 - Life-cycle monitoring of security plans, risk assessments, breaches
 - Enforce compliance with any required controls not implemented by contractor

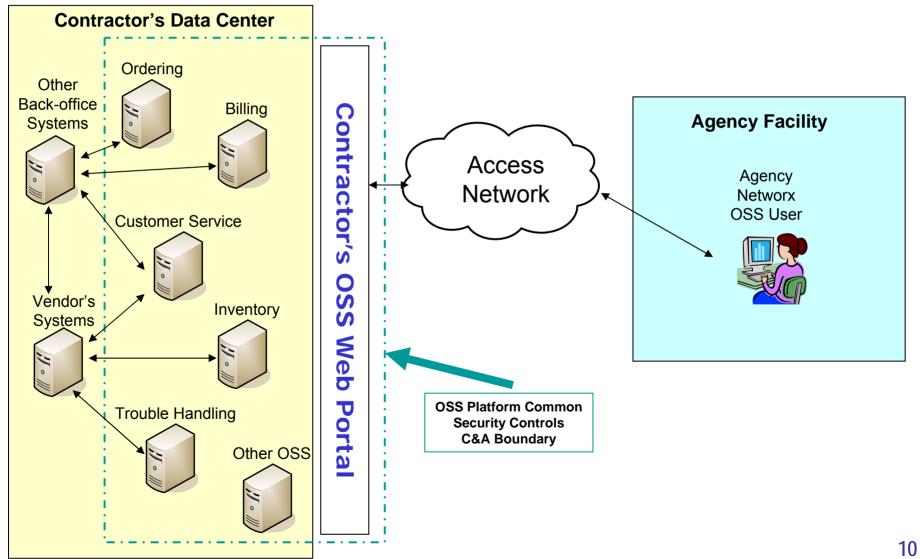


GSA Compliance Monitoring

- FAS OCIO conducts C&A on GSA's billing system
- FAS OCIO tests full set of controls to first touch point of OSS, thereby conducting C&A of all OSS
 - Done at system risk = moderate impact
 - GSA provides report of risks to Agencies
 - If Agency decides risk is unacceptable, orders additional security controls and conducts its own certification, or chooses contractor with acceptable risks
