TAX CONSULTANT PLEADS GUILTY IN FEDERAL COURT

NILE J. VINCENT, 60, of New Orleans, pled guilty in federal court today to making and subscribing a False Federal Income Tax Return in violation of federal law, announced U.S. Attorney Jim Letten.

NILE VINCENT entered into a plea agreement with the Government thereby allowing him to plead guilty to one count of filing a false Federal Income Tax Return. According to documents filed in federal court, **NILE VINCENT** was a tax consultant working for numerous clients in the City of New Orleans.

The charge to which **VINCENT** pled guilty arises out of **VINCENT'S** submission of a 2000 False Federal Income Tax Return that concealed \$25,000 in consulting income that **VINCENT** received from entity owned by Stanford Barre, Pampy, Inc.

VINCENT faces a possible sentence of up to three (3) years in federal prison followed by two (2) years of supervised release. Sentencing in this matter is set for August 7, 2007 before U. S. District Judge Jay C. Zainey.

This matter was investigated by the Criminal Investigation Division of the Internal Revenue Service. The prosecution of this case is being handled by First Assistant United States Attorney Jan Maselli Mann and Assistant U. S. Attorney Brian M. Klebba.
