NEWS RELEASE SUMMARY - March 12, 2007

United States Attorney Karen P. Hewitt announced that Lazaro Serna-Cruz was sentenced today in federal court in San Diego for knowingly concealing and attempting to transport from Mexico into the United States, more than \$10,000 in U.S. currency. United States District Judge William Q. Hayes sentenced Serna-Cruz to serve 10 months in federal prison followed by three years' supervised release.

As part of his guilty plea on December 18, 2006, Serna-Cruz admitted that he attempted to enter the United States through the Otay Mesa Port of Entry while knowingly concealing on his person and in his car approximately \$50,800 in U.S. currency. Serna-Cruz also admitted he intended to evade the United States' currency reporting requirements for amounts of \$10,000 or more.

Serna-Cruz further acknowledged that the \$50,800 constituted the proceeds of alien smuggling activity, and agreed to forfeit to the United States the entire \$50,800 he had attempted to conceal. Judge

Hayes also imposed a \$3,000 fine as part of the sentence, which he ordered could be satisfied by forfeiture

of an additional \$3,000 in money orders that Serna-Cruz possessed on the day of his arrest.
