CURRENT HUMANITARIAN SITUATION

Peace Negotiations

- Media sources reported that the sixth round of African Union (AU)-mediated negotiations between representatives of the Government of Sudan (GOS), Justice and Equality Movement (JEM), and Sudan Liberation Movement/Army (SLM/A) commenced in Abuja on September 15, amid conflicting reports about whether a unified SLM/A intends to participate in the negotiations. According to media sources, SLM/A leader Abdel Wahid Nur was en route to Abuja but had not arrived as of September 14. However, media reports also indicated that another SLM/A leader, Mini Minnawi, sent delegates to Abuja but stated that the group would not participate in negotiations until the conclusion of an all-SLM/A conference planned for September 25 to 27. In a monthly report on Sudan, U.N. Secretary General Kofi Annan urged the parties to work together to reach an agreement and improve the security situation in Darfur.
- According to media reports, the National Movement for Reform and Development (NMRD), a
 Darfur-based opposition group not invited to the talks, announced plans to reject the outcome of
 the Abuja negotiations unless the NMRD is asked to participate. Media sources reported that
 the NMRD plans to resume operations in Darfur, invalidating a ceasefire that the GOS and the
 NMRD signed in December 2004.

Security

- The humanitarian community remains concerned over the deteriorating security situation throughout Darfur. Between September 9 and 16, the USAID Disaster Assistance Response Team (USAID/DART) received numerous reports of security incidents affecting humanitarian operations in all three Darfur states.
- In a monthly humanitarian profile of Sudan, the Office of the U.N. Deputy Special Representative of the U.N. Secretary General and Humanitarian Coordinator reported that as of August 1, 21 percent of affected persons in Darfur were inaccessible to U.N. humanitarian assistance. The report attributed access restrictions primarily to insecurity, and noted that the worst restrictions were in South Darfur, where 37 percent of the population was inaccessible.
- WFP reported that as of September 13, insecurity had limited West Darfur food dispatches to 4 percent of the monthly target for September. WFP and partners are awaiting security clearance

- to deploy distribution teams by helicopter to Kongo Haraza and Beida, West Darfur, after insecurity caused organizers to cancel distributions at the sites.
- In response to growing insecurity in South Darfur, including repeated attacks on vehicles carrying food and relief commodities, representatives of the U.N. Department of Safety and Security (UNDSS) met with *jingaweit* leaders in Menawashi, Khor Abeche, Neitega, Mershing, and Al Malam. UNDSS has declared the road connecting Menawashi to El Fasher, North Darfur, closed to U.N. movement, and WFP has postponed dispatches between El Fasher and Nyala, South Darfur.
- According to U.N. agencies, on September 9, 3 people were killed and 19 injured when fighting
 erupted during food distributions in Tawilah camp, 120 km west of El Fasher. Several
 international non-governmental organizations (NGOs) evacuated staff members to El Fasher
 following the incident, and many IDPs reportedly fled the camp. UNDSS is monitoring the
 situation.
- On September 9, the U.N. Mission in Sudan (UNMIS) evacuated one UNMIS staff member and eight NGO staff members to Nyala from Feina, South Darfur, after fighting began between approximately 80 armed tribesmen and an unknown number of SLM/A troops at Kunjo village, in East Jebel Marra, West Darfur.
- The African Union Mission in Sudan (AMIS) has pledged to increase patrols in the area of Shangil Tobayi, North Darfur, where SLM/A officials reported attacks by GOS soldiers as recently as September 13. In late July 2005, Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF) temporarily evacuated staff from Shangil Tobayi camp after a group of armed men in GOS military uniforms entered the camp, opened fire, and burned shelters.

Coordination

• On September 12, the USAID/DART Food for Peace Officer attended a meeting for donors to discuss the WFP 2006 Work Plan with Country Director Ramiro da Silva. WFP reported no significant anticipated pipeline breaks in the coming months, as the current number of targeted beneficiaries is significantly lower than the 3.5 million projected in April 2005. WFP also reported that based on assessments, headcounts, and re-registration exercises, WFP and partners have expanded food distributions in rural host communities, from 140 sites in April 2005 to 350 sites currently. WFP noted that the expansion of distributions in rural areas has resulted in increased logistical demands.

Water and Sanitation

 According to UNMIS reports, OXFAM and the GOS Office of Water and Environmental Sanitation (WES) are expected to complete construction of distribution networks for two recently constructed elevated water tanks in Al Salam camp, North Darfur. Following the completion of the distribution networks, Al Salam is expected to have the capacity to supply 15 liters of water per person per day, as the camp already has 5 boreholes and 15 hand pumps.

Logistics

• WFP reported that the jet fuel shortages in El Obeid and Khartoum that hindered humanitarian operations during August have abated. The re-opening of the Khartoum refinery that processes jet fuel is scheduled for the coming days and is expected to bring fuel supplies to regular levels.

Environmental Health

• According to a U.N. World Health Organization (WHO) report, WHO, the U.N. Children's Fund (UNICEF), the South Darfur *Wali*, and South Darfur state ministries recently conducted a clean-up campaign in Nyala. WHO provided insecticides, larvicides, hand pumps, fuel, and cleaning equipment for the campaign. The organizers carried out spraying activities in breeding areas for mosquitoes and flies, in addition to removing solid waste.
