Loretta Bitner, West Virginia Chairperson of the "Alliance" The FMCSA supports the objectives of the "Alliance" and believes that with the uniformity of forms and procedures we can achieve a nationwide network of efficient, safe and effective HM registration and permitting in the highway mode.

FACTS (about the Uniform Program)

- Registration and permitting of HM motor carriers and/or HM shippers (registration only) are conducted through a base State system.
- The *base State* will collect all fees and distribute them as appropriate to participating States.
- Motor Carriers must not have an unsatisfactory U.S. DOT Safety Rating or have a State equivalent unsatisfactory rating for carriers not subject to Federal jurisdiction.
- The alliance "board" consists of one member from each of the participating States.



- Participating base States can issue a reciprocal National permit and/or registration that will allow the company to operate in all participating jurisdictions.
- The uniform program is both a registration and permitting program. Registration is to identify HM motor carriers and shippers. Permitting is a right to operate based upon safety fitness.
- There may be additional program requirements for motor carriers of Hazardous Waste.
- The motor carrier and/or shipper will apply to it's *base State* for the permit and/or registration.
- Each State will still be able to assess fees as they deem appropriate.


