
LEADERSHIP IN CONFLICT SITUATIONS, A CASE FROM COLOMBIA

- Use of force has not been the panacea
- Social investment must be the axis for the reconstruction of Colombia




GUERRILLA AND PARAMILITARY GROUPS IN COLOMBIA

Effects of Armed Conflict

- Increased recruitment of children and adolescents
- Loss of capital
- Increased forced desplacement
- Increased numbers of people missing and or killed
- Fragmentation of social fabric
- Loss of cultural and territorial roots

BRIDGING LEADERSHIP PEACE & RESTORATION CENTRES

- A GEOGRAPHIC PLACE WHERE A SERIES OF SOCIAL & ECONIMIC INTERVENTIONS ARE CONCENTRATED AND DIRECTED TOWARDS:
- Reconstruction of social fabric
- Confict resolution and peace recovery
- Protection of the environment

- The project will establish 5 urban, and 10 rural Peace andRestoration Centres in Colombia
- Centers build on grass-roots efforts to solve their problems (Paz y Bien and Vallenpaz)
- Engagement of different actors/stakeholders
- Local & authorities, private sector, local university, CSOs (, AlvarAlice, Paz y Bien, Vallenpaz, Corona)

BRIDGING LEADERSHIP Restorative Justice

- Defined as a "Systematic response to wrongdoing that emphasizes the healing of the wounds of victims, offenders and communities, affected by criminal behavior"
- In the words of Archbishop D. Tutu ..." The central concern is not retribution or punishment, (but rather) the healing of breaches and readdressing the imbalances, the restoration of broken relationships, a seeking to rehabilitate both the victim and the perpetrator, who should be given the opportunity to be reintegrated to the community he has injured with his offense".

- Engagement of stakeholders, community organizations, NGOs, public and private sector
- Consensus building (including armed actors)
- Integrated strategies Urban-rural (Vallenpaz marketing, relocation of forced displaced population in rural areas)
- Integration of academe-local government agents (Javeriana University, House of Justice, Excelence in Justice Corporation, Paz y Bien & AlvarAlice)
- Working on Log Frames, setting of goals, indicators, activities, and budgets

- Do not know how to work collectively
- Lack technical knowledge
- Lack administrative basic skills
- Lack access to productive chains and / or marketing
- Many of them are women suffering from forced displacement, adolescents, and young farmers

OVERALL GOAL

Promote conflict resolution by applying principles and practices of Restorative Justice in association with income generation, and social, educational and eco-agricultural interventions in selected urban and rural areas

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES URBAN

- Promotion of Restorative Justice and Human Rights. Drop violence rates by 10%
- Institutional strengthening of CSO / NGOs
- Improvement of life conditions trough income generating projects.



SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES RURAL

- Enhancing community sustainability
- Promotion of Restorative Justice, Human Rights; Drop violence rate by 10%
- Improving living conditions
- Improvement of social and physical infrastructure



OBJECTIVES ACADEMIC COMPONENT

- Document, systematize and disseminate international and national experiences on Restorative Justice
- Incorporate contents of Restorative Justice in the curricula of at least three law & political science schools.

Restorative Justice, Coexistence & Peace in Colombia

Constraints

- Lack of trust (comunities, private sector, donor agencies)
- Widespread violence / insecurity
- Widespread corruption within politicians and local authorities
- Farmers used to get "easy money" from illegal crops / drug trade
- Culture based on individualism Vs community solidarity

Institutionalization and Sustainability

- Development/strengthening of alliances among community organizations, government agencies and the private sector are key elements for success
- Activities based on resources mobilized from both public and private sectors to leverage international cooperation
- Income generating activities critical for sustainability, as well as entry points to assure rapid and early community acceptance and participation
