To date, the Commission has compiled and evaluated such claims against 18 countries: Yugoslavia, Panama, Bulgaria, Hungary, Romania, Italy, the Soviet Union, Czechoslovakia, Poland, Cuba, China, the former German Democratic Republic (East Germany), Vietnam, Ethiopia, Egypt, Iran, Albania, and the Federal Republic of Germany.
