SUBJECT: TRAFFIC VOLUME TRENDS

On the basis of preliminary estimates, total travel on rural roads in November 1946 exceeded the amount of such traffic in November 1941 by one percent. The increase on main highways was 4 percent above, while that on local roads was 8 percent below the 1941 figures.

Traffic in the two western regions was 16 percent above corresponding 1941 counts; while that in the central regions was approximately the same; and the eastern regions was 4 percent below 1941 levels. In comparison with 1945 figures, traffic in the western regions increased 14 percent, while that in the central regions increased 19 percent, and that in the eastern regions increased 26 percent.

Comparisons of city traffic in November 1946 with corresponding traffic in November 1945 are as follows:

- 6 stations in Chicago, Illinois +22.8 percent
- 3 stations in Columbus, Ohio +18.2 percent
- 3 stations in Detroit, Michigan +10.5 percent
- 5 stations in St. Louis, Missouri +10.3 percent
- 1 station in Santa Fe, New Mexico +20.6 percent
- 11 stations in Washington, D. C. +15.0 percent







FIGURE 1.— PERCENTAGE RELATIONS OF RURAL TRAFFIC IN MONTHS OF 1944, 1945
AND 1946 WITH THAT IN CORRESPONDING MONTHS OF 1941.






FIGURE 2.- VEHICLE-MILES OF TRAVEL ON ALL RURAL ROADS
