SUBJECT: TRAFFIC VOLUME TRENDS

In November large traffic increases were found on all main highways compared to November 1944, these increases being larger in most States than those found at comparable locations in the previous month. Increases of over 80 percent were found in California, and traffic in several other States increased around 60 percent.

On local roads, increases over November 1944 were found at all points except one in Wisconsin. In general, however, these increases were smaller than those on main highways.

Traffic in the two western regions was 5.1 percent above corresponding 1941 counts, while that in the four central regions was 15.4 percent below, and that in the three eastern regions 21.0 percent below the 1941 figures. For the United States as a whole, the traffic was 39.7 percent above the 1944 levels but still 2.4 percent below that of 1940, and 13.9 percent below that of 1941.

Comparisons of city traffic in November with corresponding traffic in November 1944 are as follows:

- 6 stations in Chicago, Illinois +20.1 percent.
- 3 stations in Detroit, Michigan + 9.9 percent.
- 1 station in Santa Fe, New Mexico +20.1 percent.
- 5 stations in St. Louis, Missouri +23.9 percent.







FIGURE 1 - VEHICLE-MILES OF TRAVEL ON ALL RURAL ROADS
1944 1940 TO 1945 BY MONTHS.






FIGURE 2.- PERCENTAGE RELATIONS OF RURAL TRAFFIC IN MONTHS OF 1944
