The State did not meet its FFY 2005 target of 100%.</p> <p>The State reported that prior noncompliance was partially corrected.</p>	<p>The State revised its improvement activities for this indicator in its SPP and OSEP accepts those revisions.</p> <p>OSEP's March 24, 2006, FFY 2004 SPP response letter required the State to include in the February 1, 2007 APR data demonstrating compliance with the requirements in 34 CFR §303.148(b)(2)(i) (as amended by IDEA section 637(a)(9)), that for all children receiving early intervention services under Part C and potentially eligible under Part B, a transition conference is convened, with the approval of the family, between the lead agency, the family, and the LEA at least 90 days and, at the discretion of the parties, up to nine months, before the child is eligible for the preschool services.</p> <p>The State reported that two of four LLAs that had findings in FFY 2004 had not corrected their findings with the transition conference requirements in 34 CFR §303.148(b)(2)(i) (as amended by IDEA section 637(a)(9)).</p> <p>The State must implement and evaluate its improvement activities and revise them, if appropriate, to ensure they will enable the State to include data in the FFY 2006 APR, due February 1, 2008, that demonstrate compliance with the IFSP transition planning requirements in 34 CFR §303.148(b)(2)(i) (as amended by IDEA section 637(a)(9)), including correction by the two LLAs identified in FFY 2004 and any noncompliance identified in FFY 2005.</p>

General supervision system (including monitoring, complaints, hearings, etc.) identifies and corrects noncompliance as soon as possible but in no case later than one year from identification.</p> <p>[Compliance Indicator]</p>	<p>The State's FFY 2005 data do not reflect the measurement for this indicator.</p> <p>However, OSEP determined that the State did not meet its target of 100% for this indicator, because the State reported that two of six LLAs with findings from FFY 2004 had not completed corrective actions.</p>	<p>OSEP's March 24, 2006 SPP response letter required the State to include in the February 1, 2007 APR data demonstrating that noncompliance is corrected within one year of its identification, consistent with the provisions at 34 CFR §303.501(b).</p> <p>OSEP could not determine the percentage of compliance with this indicator because the State did not use the appropriate measurement to provide a percentage based on the number of findings (not the number of programs) that were timely corrected. The State's FFY 2005 data were based upon the FFY 2004 SPP template, which was revised for FFY 2005 APR reporting. The State</p>
