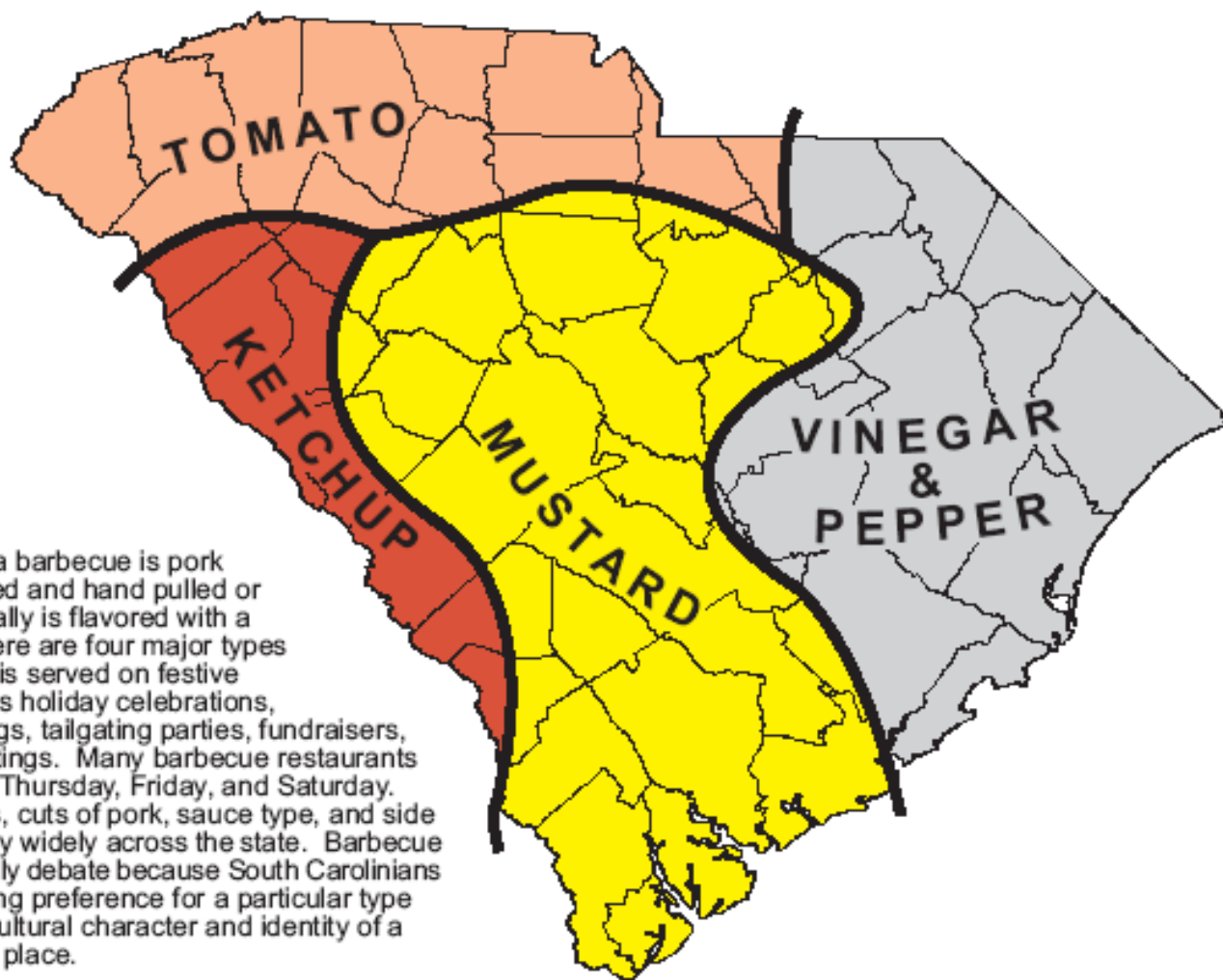


BARBECUE REGIONS

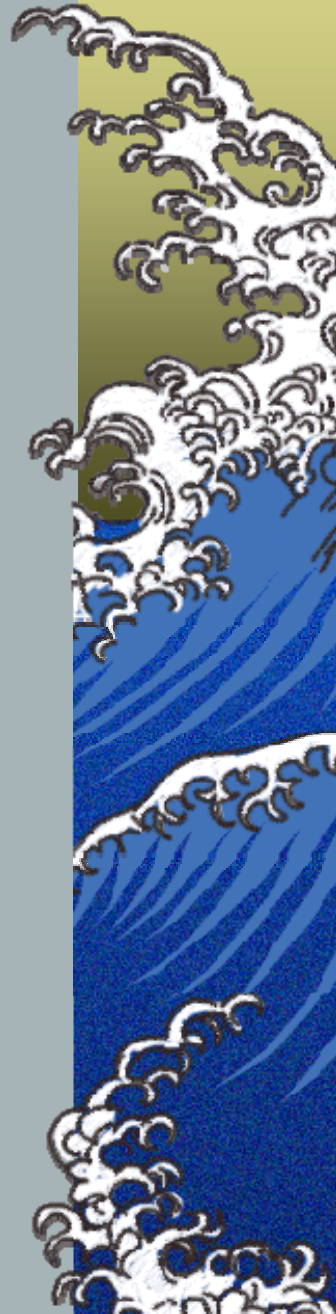


South Carolina barbecue is pork that is slow cooked and hand pulled or shredded. It usually is flavored with a tangy sauce. There are four major types of sauce. It often is served on festive occasions such as holiday celebrations, reunions, weddings, tailgating parties, fundraisers, and political meetings. Many barbecue restaurants are open only on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. Cooking methods, cuts of pork, sauce type, and side dishes served vary widely across the state. Barbecue encourages friendly debate because South Carolinians often have a strong preference for a particular type that reflects the cultural character and identity of a specific region or place.

Traditional organizational structure

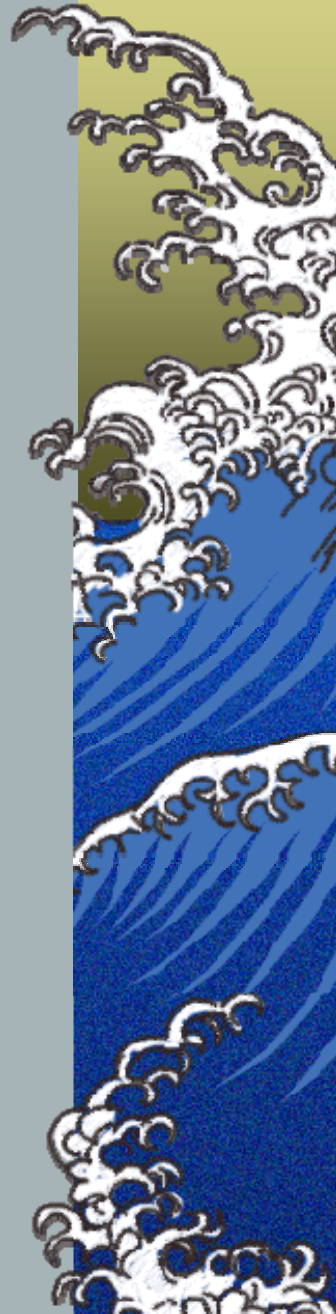


Organization Chart



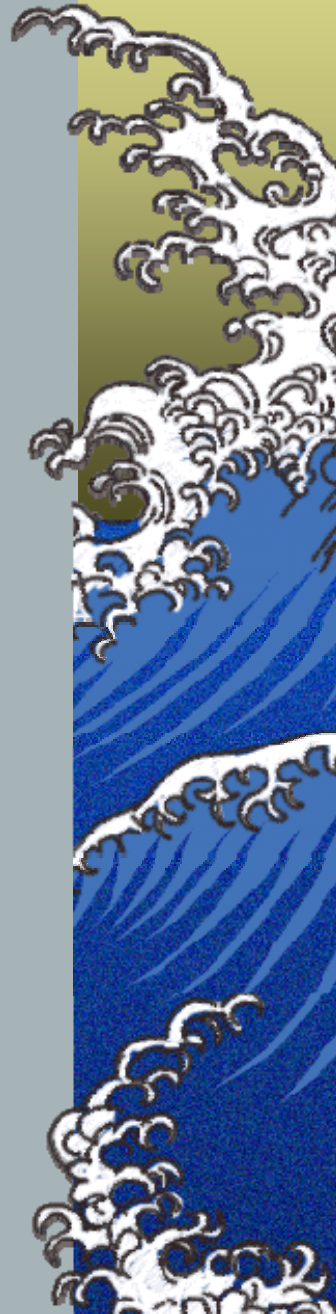

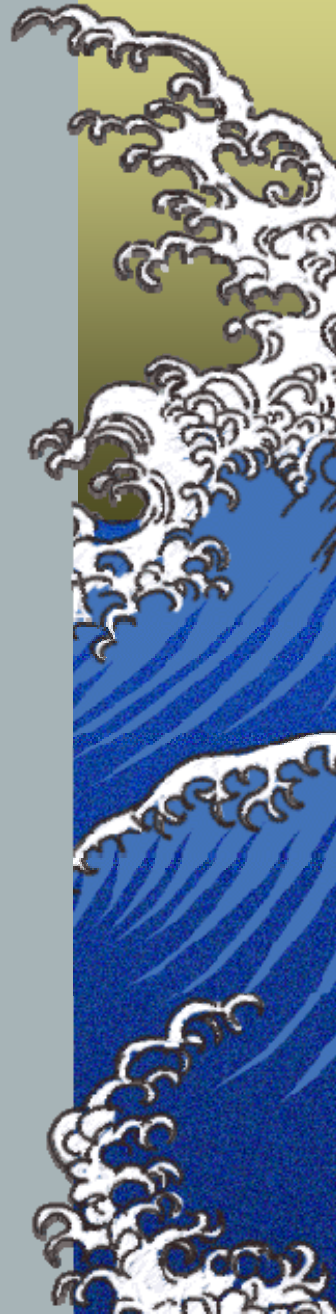
Preparation

- ▄ ***Made about 5,000 (!!!!) corrections to bibliographic records in the***



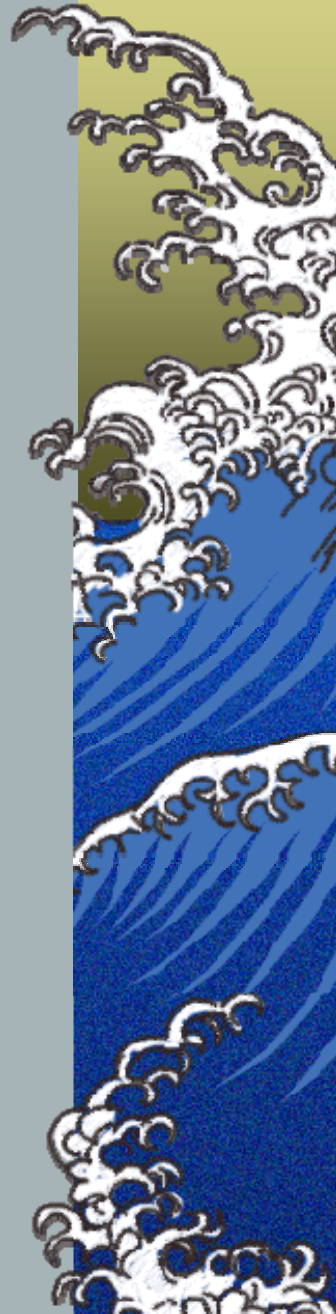
Staffing

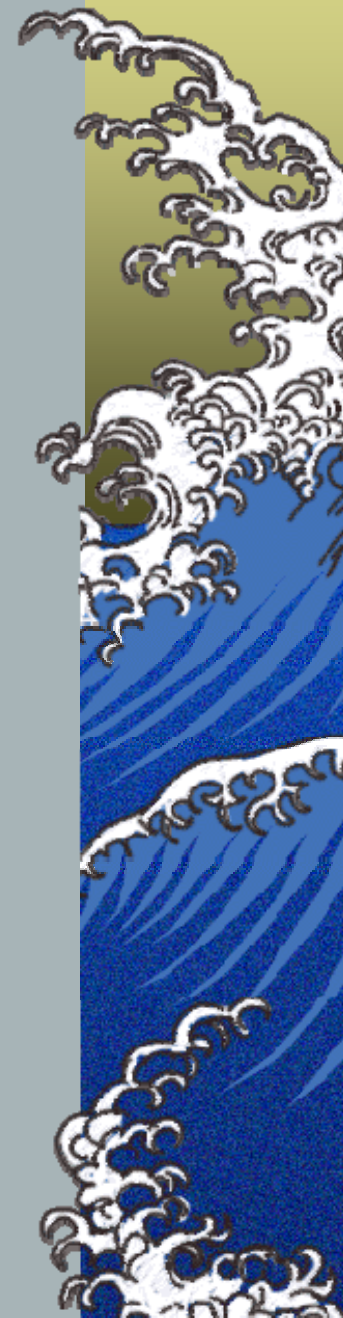

Ways to increase access to EL documents

- *Select more EL item numbers*
- *Add bibliographic data for EL selections to the OPAC*
- *Sign up for the PURL referral service from GPO*
- *Subscribe to “Documents without Shelves” or other similar service*

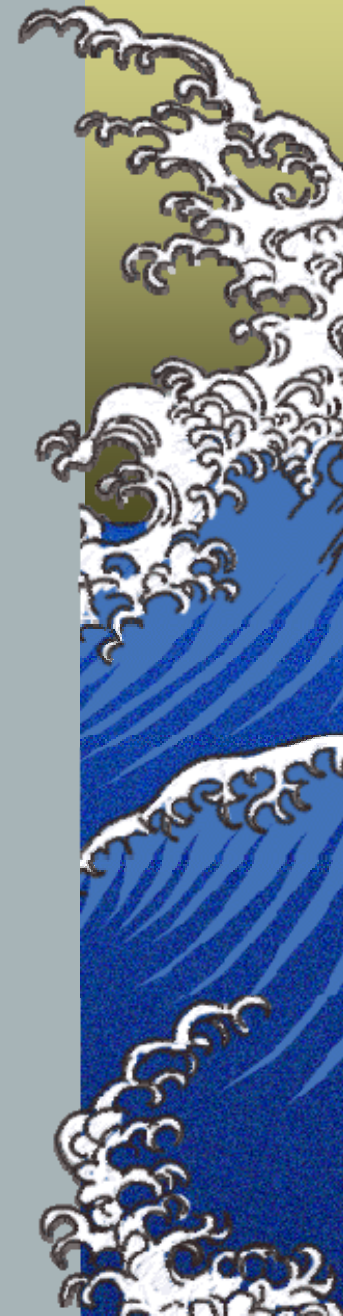

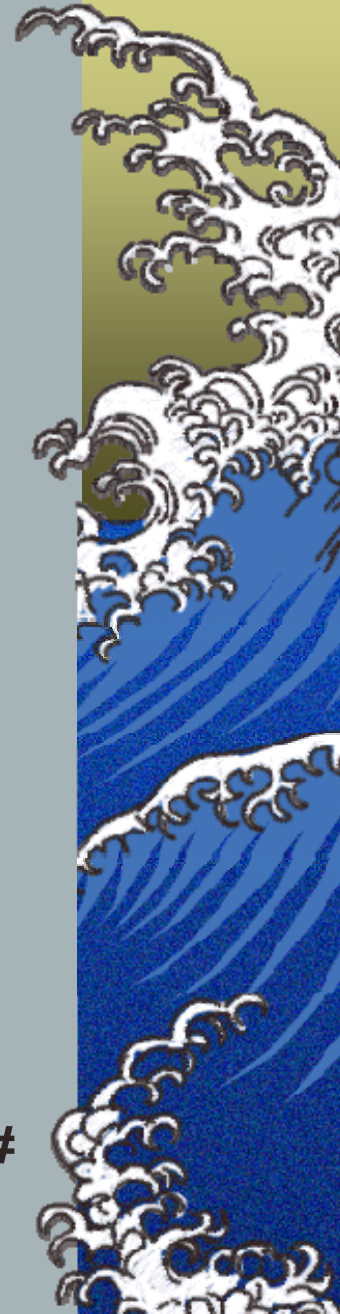


Has your library signed up for the Statistical Information Request from GPO to obtain statistical data on the number of hits to GPO Access from your OPAC?

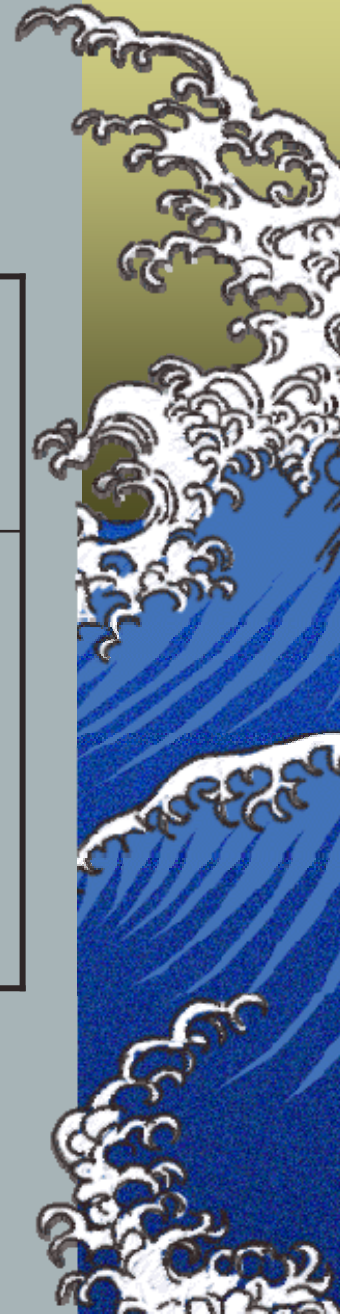

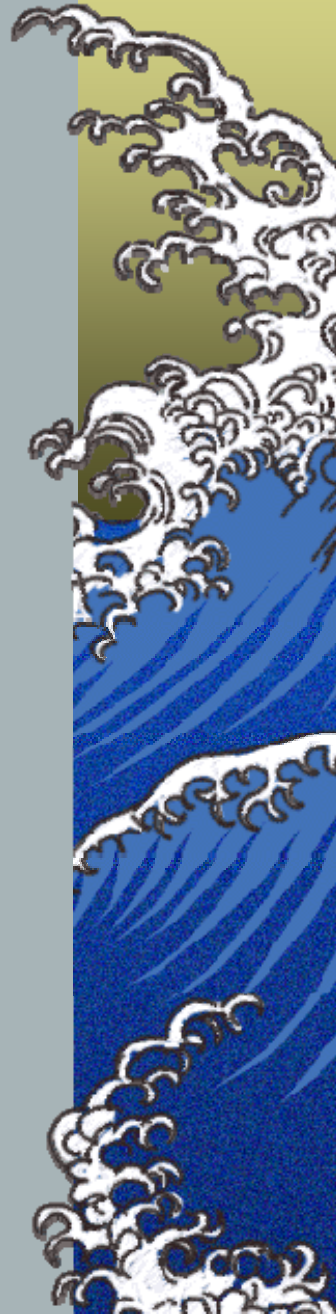
Clemson's purl referrals
