

Dear Mr. Chairman:

On October 19, 1988, your predecessor asked us to review the Department of Defense fiscal year 1990 budget request for automated data processing resources to assist the Subcommittee in its budget deliberations. As part of this request, we agreed on January 11, 1989, to provide your office with budget information from four Defense Reports on Obligations for Information Technology Systems. This report provides Department of the Navy budget information.

Our information comes from the Navy's reports for fiscal years 1987, 1988/1989, amended 1988/1989, and 1990/1991. They are required by Office of Management and Budget Circular A-11, Preparation and Submission of Budget Estimates. As specified in the circular, they show the Navy's obligations for information technology activities by fiscal year distributed among such categories as capital investment, personnel, rental and other, and commercial services. The obligation reports also distribute obligations among appropriation accounts—such as Other Procurement, Navy; Operation and Maintenance, Navy; and Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Navy.

Appendixes I-III depict Navy information technology obligations over 5 years, fiscal years 1986-1990. Appendix I shows total information technology obligations, which have increased slightly since fiscal year 1986. Appendix II, which shows these obligations distributed by appropriation account, indicates that most obligations are from the Operation and Maintenance, Navy account. The first figure in appendix III shows that capital investment obligations have decreased, while personnel obligations have increased. To distinguish equipment lease obligations from the total rental and other category, figure III.2 contains a detailed breakout of obligations for equipment leases, space leases, and supplies. This figure shows that equipment lease obligations have decreased, while obligations for supplies have increased. Appendix III also shows capital

investment obligations and Other Procurement, Navy obligations to indicate potential procurement funding for capital investment purchases. Over half the capital investment obligations come from sources other than procurement funds.

We compared original obligation estimates and actual obligations for fiscal years 1987 and 1988 only. These comparisons are shown in appendixes IV and V, respectively. Actual fiscal year 1987 obligations exceeded the original fiscal year 1987 estimated obligations, while the opposite occurred for fiscal year 1988. Finally, appendix VI shows the actual data extracted for this report.

Our work was conducted in February and March 1989. We discussed the contents of this fact sheet with an Office of the Secretary of Defense representative and incorporated his views where appropriate.

We are providing copies of this report to the Chairmen, House and Senate Committees on Appropriations; the Chairmen, House and Senate Committees on Armed Services; the Chairman, House Committee on Government Operations; and the Chairman, Senate Committee on Governmental Affairs. We are also providing copies to the Secretary of Defense; the Secretary of the Navy; and the Director, Office of Management and Budget. We will make copies available to other interested parties upon request.


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Information Technology Obligations by Fiscal Year








Information Technology Obligations by Appropriation Account

Obligations by Appropriation Account





Figure III.2: Information Technology Rental and Other Obligations by Subcategory




Figure III.3: Information Technology Obligations for Capital Investments and for Other Procurement, Navy





Figure III.4: Percentage of Information Technology Obligations by Category



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


Figure IV.2: Estimated Versus Actual Information Technology Obligations for Fiscal Year 1987 by Appropriation Account

Figure IV.3: Estimated Versus Actual Information Technology Obligations for Fiscal Year 1987 by Category





Figure V.1: Estimated Versus Actual Information Technology Obligations for Fiscal Year 1988





Figure V.2: Estimated Versus Actual Information Technology Obligations for Fiscal Year 1988 by Appropriation Account


2.0 Total Obligations (Dollars in Billions)
