Guidelines for Poster Presentations

1. FORMAT:

- a. In the upper left, clearly state the objective of the study; avoid a lengthy abstract.
- b. At the end, include a clear statement of conclusions.
- c. Everything between the objective and the conclusions should be succinctly and concisely focused on evidence in support of the conclusions
- d. Use figures and graphics as supporting evidence
 - (1) Include short, clearly stated titles
 - (2) Label axes, points, symbols, and lines clearly
 - (3) Make figures and graphics large enough to be read easily six feet away from the poster.
- e. Use bullet points of only 5-8 words
- f. Use a font that is easily readable six feet away from the poster.
- g. Avoid background pictures, colors, logos, and abstract designs that distract from the primary message.

2. CONTENT

- a. Keep in mind:
 - (1) You will not have the attention of readers for more than 2-3 minutes
 - (2) Even with a perfect poster, the readers will not remember more 1-2 points the next day
- b. Focus the entire poster on the 2-3 points you would like the reader to remember
- c. Too much information is as bad as too little information.
