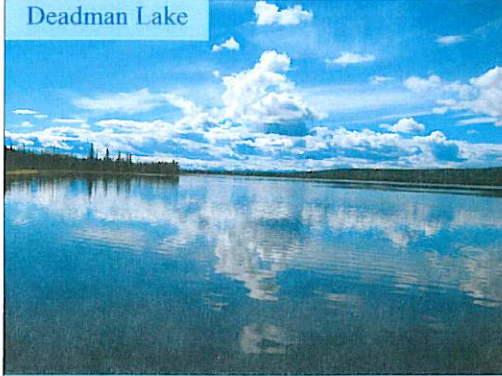




## Tetlin National Wildlife Refuge Volunteer Program



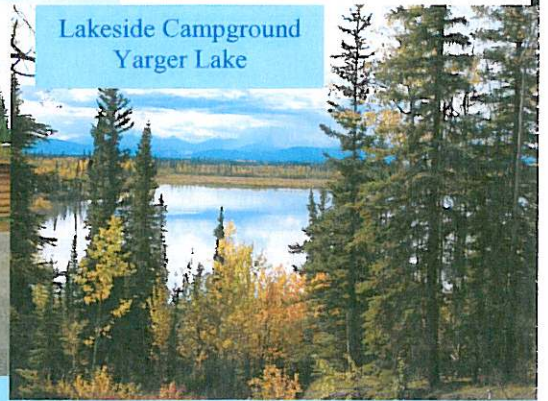
Deadman Lake

**Are you interested in experiencing the wildlife, habitats, and Native culture of Interior Alaska?**

**By volunteering through one of these programs at the Tetlin National Wildlife Refuge, YOU can make a difference!**

- **Deadman Lake Campground RV Host** - Mile 1249 Alaska Highway- is one of two campgrounds on our Refuge. Campground volunteers conduct visitor contacts, help with campground maintenance, small construction projects, and evening interpretive programs.
- **Tetlin Visitor Center** – Milepost 1229 (8 miles from US/ Canada border, 90 miles from Tok) is a beautiful log cabin center which offers a spectacular view of the Refuge from its large viewing deck. Inside are new exhibits for 2009 along with Native arts demonstrations. Visitor Center volunteers help with the operation and maintenance as well as giving interpretive programs to visitors.
  - **The Tetlin Refuge Headquarters**, near Milepost 1316 Alaska Highway, is located 90 miles west of the Canadian border in Tok. Volunteers assist with routine maintenance/ grounds keeping, and small construction projects as well as a variety of educational, interpretive, and outreach activities associated with the Refuge visitor facilities.

We're looking for friendly, energetic couples to help fill 6 week positions either June 8—July 17 or July 15- August 27, 2009. These opportunities are for couples traveling with their RV trained in visitor services and maintenance.

Each location has a RV site (up to 35') with varying accommodations for water, power, and sewer. Volunteers work four days/week for a total 32 hours and are reimbursed \$25/day/ person while on site. Applicants should have prior experience in communicating with the public, possess basic maintenance skills, be able to lift and carry up to 30 lbs., possess current CPR and first aid certifications, and have valid driver's licenses. Volunteers will need to work independently and with guidance from refuge staff.
