

## **Kenneth D. Fisher, Ph.D.**

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Dr. Fisher is Senior Scientific Consultant, Office of Dietary Supplements (ODS), Office of the Director, National Institutes of Health. From June 2002 until January 2004, he coordinated the development of the ODS Strategic Plan for 2004-2009. Since that time, he has assisted in the implementation of the ODS Strategic Plan and evaluation of current ODS programs.

In 2001 he was a Scientific Consultant to the Committee to Develop a Framework for Evaluation of the Safety of Dietary Supplements, Food and Nutrition Board, National Research Council, National Academy of Sciences. From September 2000 to March 2002, he was on the scientific staff of the White House Commission on Complementary and Alternative Medicine Policy. From December 1997 to June 2001, he was Senior Nutrition Consultant, Office of Disease Prevention and Health Promotion, Department of Health and Human Services. From July 1995 until November 1997, he was the Executive Director, Commission on Dietary Supplement Labels (1995-1997).

Until his retirement in 1994, Dr. Fisher was on the staff of the Life Sciences Research Office, Federation of American Societies for Experimental Biology for 27 years and served as the Director of the Life Sciences Research Office from 1977 until 1994. During that time he directed a number of scientific reviews and evaluations of topics in the life sciences related to nutrition, physiology, toxicology, and food safety. He held academic appointments at South Dakota State University (1960-1963), the University of Vermont (1963-1968), and Montgomery College (1969-1985).

Dr. Fisher attended Oberlin College (1949-1951); was graduated from the University of Vermont (B.S., 1953; M.S., 1955); North Carolina State University (Ph.D., 1960) and Montgomery College (A.A., 1988).

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
