## Capacity Building Track: Session Highlights

CBI-10: Introduction to Asset-Based Community Development Presenter: Josh Bowling – Indianapolis Neighborhood Resource Center

We all know how important the Executive Director is to the life and continuity of nonprofit organizations, so parting ways can prove difficult. Occasionally, their departure is known well in advance and can be carefully planned. But more often, the departure is sudden and pushes the board into a role they did not sign up for: running the organization while recruiting a replacement. If handled properly, this transition period can be a chance for the board to build the capacity of the organization. Learn how to prepare your organization to more effectively deal with an unplanned or planned departure and turn it into a more positive, less stressful, experience for the board and the organization. Every participant will leave with a template for an Emergency Succession Plan.



Governor Daniels recently announced a new state award to recognize Indiana's top high school talent in math and science. The Hoosier High School Math and Science Awards will be given each year to the state's best high school math student and best science student.

All Indiana high school students are eligible to receive the award and can apply online. Nominations from teachers, principals and other school staff members will also be accepted. Application criteria will include such information as SAT, ACT and Advanced

Placement scores, awards and prizes as well as grades received in math and science courses. Winners, who will be acknowledged as Mr. or Miss Math or Science, respectively, will be selected by a committee of high school math and science teachers, curriculum experts from the Indiana Department of Education, and the Governor's Office.

The award was developed with input from the Indiana Science Technology Engineering Mathematics (I-STEM) Network, the Hoosier Association of Science Teachers, Inc. (HASTI), the Indiana Council of Teachers of Mathematics (ICTM) and the Indiana Association of Public School Superintendents.
