### IS MY ORGANIZATION READY FOR AN AMERICORPS\*STATE GRANT?

This Readiness Assessment Questionnaire will help organizations to assess their capacity to operate a high quality AmeriCorps\*State program.

The questionnaire is also useful for organizations seeking funding from other government agencies, foundations, or individuals. While a few questions are specific to AmeriCorps\*State programs, most would be asked by any funder considering making a significant investment in the organization.

This questionnaire asks the reader to score the organization on elements necessary to run a high quality program, by selecting the answer that best describes the organization's current status or performance.

#### **RESULTS**

- **45 points or more:** Based on your self-assessment, the organization likely has the capacity to successfully operate an AmeriCorps\*State project or other government program.
- **35-44 points:** Based on your self-assessment, the organization may need to a make a few improvements in your capacity and planning to succeed.
- Less than 35 points: Based on your self-assessment, the organization may have a significant need to build its capacity. Applying for AmeriCorps\*State or other competitive funds may not be a suitable option for you at this time.

This assessment is intended only as a general guide. Successful completion of the assessment does not guarantee funding from OFBCI or any other organization.

### **AmeriCorps\*State Specific**

Does the organization have the ability to effectively utilize at least ten full time equivalent AmeriCorps members?

Does the organization have sufficient workspace and equipment for the AmeriCorps members?

Does the organization have non-AmeriCorps revenue of over \$200,000 per year?

If the answer to any of these questions is no, consideration should be given to becoming part of an AmeriCorps consortium. Serving as an AmeriCorps host site, rather than as a primary grant applicant is often a better choice for smaller organizations.

#### For Faith-Based Organizations seeking to operate government funded programs

Participation in government funded programs will be open to all who qualify, without regard to religious beliefs.

No participant in a government funded program will be required to participate in inherently religious activities.

Government funded programs will be held in a separate place or time from religious activities.

If these conditions are not acceptable to an organization, government funding is probably not a good option.

#### **Next Steps**

The Office of Faith-Based and Community Initiatives is ready to assist organizations in the State of Indiana.
