## PROPOSED DECISION

This claim against the Government of Albania is based upon the alleged confiscation of real and personal property located in Pac, District of Tropoje.

Under section 4(a) of Title I of the International Claims Settlement Act of 1949 ("ICSA"), as amended, the Commission has jurisdiction to

receive, examine, adjudicate, and render final decisions with respect to claims of . . . nationals of the United States included within the terms of . . . any claims agreement on and after March 10, 1954, concluded between the Government of the United States and a foreign government (exclusive of governments against which the United States declared the existence of a state of war during World War II) . . . providing for the settlement and discharge of claims of . . . nationals of the United States against a foreign government, arising out of the nationalization or other taking of property, by the agreement of the Government of the United States to accept from that government a sum in en bloc settlement thereof.

22 U.S.C. 1623(a) (1994).

The Governments of the United States and Albania concluded an agreement for en bloc settlement of claims of United States nationals against Albania on March 10, 1995. Agreement Between the Government of the United States and the Government of the Republic of Albania on the Settlement of Certain Outstanding Claims, March 10, 1995 (entered into force April 18, 1995) ("Settlement Agreement"). Claims covered by the Settlement Agreement are

the claims of United States nationals (including natural and juridical persons) against Albania arising from any nationalization, expropriation, intervention, or other taking of, or measures affecting, property of nationals of the United States prior to the date of this agreement[.]

Settlement Agreement, Article 1(a).

The claimant in this case has asserted that the property which is the subject of his claim was confiscated by the Albanian government in September 1969. The claimant further asserts that he was the owner of the property at that time, and that he was a United States national, by naturalization in 1968. However, these recent statements conflict with a registration form that claimant filed with the Commission in March 1992. At that time, the claimant stated that the property was taken in May 1949 and indicated that he was then an Albanian citizen.

By Commission letter dated October 24, 1995, the claimant was asked to explain the apparent inconsistency between his 1995 claim form and his 1992 registration form. To date, however, no response has been received. Nor has the claimant submitted documentation or other evidence to establish his United States nationality or to substantiate his ownership of the claimed property or its confiscation.

Section 531.6(d) of the Commission's regulations provides:

The claimant shall be the moving party, and shall have the burden of proof on all issues involved in the determination of his or her claim.

## 45 C.F.R. 531.6(d) (1994).

The Commission finds that the claimant has not met the burden of proof in that he has failed to submit supporting evidence to establish his United States nationality, his ownership of the property which is the subject of his claim, and the date and circumstances of its alleged confiscation. In the absence of such evidence, the Commission is unable to find that, at the time the property in question was assertedly taken by the Albanian government, it was owned by a national of the United States. Accordingly, while the Commission sympathizes with the claimant for the loss of his family's property, it must conclude that his claim is not compensable under the terms of the Settlement Agreement. The claim therefore must be and is hereby denied.

The Commission finds it unnecessary to make determinations with respect to other elements of this claim.
