Dear Mr. Chairman:

This fact sheet responds to your request for information on contracting for consulting services by federal agencies. It contains (1) federal agencies' fiscal year 1987 consulting services contract obligations based on criteria recommended by the President's Cabinet Council on Management and Administration and (2) amounts actually reported by the General Services Administration's (GSA) Federal Procurement Data System (FPDS) as agencies' obligations for consulting services contracts in fiscal year 1987.

We have done considerable work in the past on the use of consultants. Since agencies begin their budget preparation long before the actual budget year starts, they need some flexibility to respond to unforeseen demands. Consultants can play a valuable role in helping agencies achieve their mission effectively and efficiently. However, we have found that the government's use of consultants has been vulnerable to abuse and improprieties.

OBLIGATIONS FOR CONSULTING SERVICES CONTRACTS

Recognizing that substantial underreporting of consulting services contracts was occurring, the Cabinet Council determined that four categories of product/service codes in FPDS were solely for consulting services. The four categories were as follows:

-- Management and Professional Services.

- -- Special Studies and Analyses.
- -- Technical Assistance.
- -- Management Reviews of Program-Funded Organizations.

In addition, the Cabinet Council identified the following seven other categories of product/service codes that <u>could</u> include consulting services:

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- -- Management and Support Services for Research and Development (excluding procurement actions related to maintenance type services).
- -- Technical Representatives (study activities only).
- -- Quality Controls (study activities only).
- -- Special Medical Services (study activities only).
- -- Public Relations (study activities only).
- -- Training.
- -- Engineering Development and Operational Systems Development Stages of Research and Development.

As discussed in our testimony before your Subcommittee on June 13, 1988, FPDS reported that federal agencies incurred contract obligations of \$245 million for consulting services in fiscal year 1987 (see app. III). Using the reporting criteria established by the Cabinet Council increases this amount substantially. Reported obligations under the first four categories identified by the Cabinet Council totaled about \$4 billion for fiscal year 1987. The other seven categories identified by the Cabinet Council included contract obligations of over \$16 billion. Information is not readily available for determining the extent of consulting services that may be included in the \$16 billion. (See apps. I and II.)

OBSERVATIONS RELATED TO CONSULTING SERVICES CONTRACTS

The Office of Management and Budget improved its guidance to federal agencies on the reporting of consulting services contracts in its January 1988 revision to Circular No. A-120. The revised circular generally reflects the categories the Cabinet Council identified as being solely for consulting services. However, the revised circular does not completely cover the seven categories the Cabinet Council determined could involve consulting services. This still leaves agencies with considerable discretion in identifying consulting services contracts, and underreporting could continue.

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Also, the revised circular does not address two FPDS limitations that result in underreporting of consulting services contracts. The first relates to contract actions for \$25,000 or less. The second relates to contract actions for products or services but for which consulting services do not form the predominant part of the contract obligation.

Agencies are not required to report individual contract actions for \$25,000 or less to GSA for entry into the FPDS. Instead, they can aggregate on a consolidated agency statement all such actions without identifying the relevant procurement categories. When contract actions are aggregated in this manner, it is not possible to identify which of the actions were for consulting services. Since our June 13 testimony, we have learned that FPDS reports show that some agencies have individually reported contract actions for \$25,000 or less to FPDS even though they are not required to do so. However, information is not readily available to determine the extent to which that has occurred.

The second limitation involves contract actions that include consulting services along with other types of products and/or services. In these cases, FPDS instructions require agencies to identify consulting services obligations only when they constitute the predominant part of these contract actions. Thus, the above \$4 billion amount does not include contract actions in which consulting services were not the major part.

SCOPE AND METHODOLOGY

We obtained the fiscal year 1987 contract obligations for each of the procurement categories identified by the President's Cabinet Council on Management and Administration from GSA's FPDS. We did not verify the accuracy of the information obtained. Also, we did not determine the extent to which FPDS reporting system limitations resulted in an understatement of reported obligations for consulting services because data were not readily available to do this.

As you requested, we combined the fiscal year 1987 obligations in the same agency groupings that were included in appropriations bills for fiscal year 1989. The information in this fact sheet includes FPDS reported contract obligations for consulting services for all agencies that are covered by 11 of the 13 appropriations

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bills for fiscal year 1989. We did not include agencies covered by the Legislative and District of Columbia appropriations bills because agencies that fall under these appropriations do not report contract obligations to GSA for inclusion in FPDS.

Also, we combined the Department of Defense and Military Construction appropriations bills because reported fiscal year 1987 contract obligations could not be applied to each bill separately. We also summarized FPDS data that agencies identified and reported as consulting services in fiscal year 1987.
