Great concern is being expressed by Wisconsin citizens and businesses as we wait and wonder what might happen to Midwest Airlines in the weeks ahead.

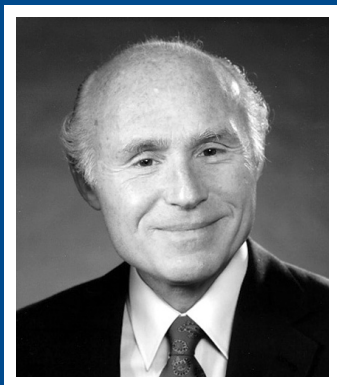
That is why it is important that we join them today to express support for our Hometown Airline.

- Our neighbors and their families may suffer from the loss of hundreds of high-quality jobs Midwest now provides.

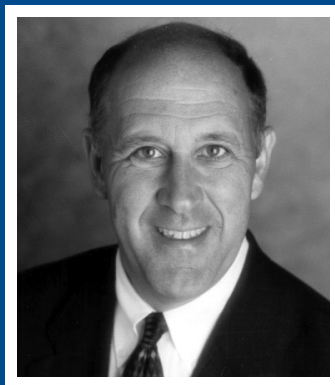
