UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

S. 1 (ORDER NO. 1)

1.—Ordered, That on Friday, January 12, 2007, at 9:30 a.m., the Senate resume consideration of S. 1, a bill to provide greater transparency in the legislative process; provided that the Senate proceed to the consideration, en bloc, of Amdt. No. 1, as modified, offered by the Senator from Massachusetts (Mr. Kerry) and Amdt. No. 10 offered by the Senator from Louisiana (Mr. Vitter); further, that the time until 9:50 a.m. run concurrently on both amendments, with the time equally divided and controlled between the two Leaders, or their designees; provided further, that at 9:50 a.m., without further intervening action or debate, the Senate proceed to a vote on Amdt. No. 1, as modified, to be followed by a vote on Amdt. No. 10, and that no amendments be in order to either amendment; and that there be 2 minutes for debate equally divided between the votes. (*January 11, 2007.*)
